

⁵ Put to death therefore what is earthly in you: sexual immorality, impurity, passion, evil desire, and covetousness, which is idolatry. ⁶ On account of these the wrath of God is coming. ⁷ In these you too once walked, when you were living in them. ⁸ But now you must put them all away: anger, wrath, malice, slander, and obscene talk from your mouth. ⁹ Do not lie to one another, seeing that you have put off the old self with its practices ¹⁰ and have put on the new self, which is being renewed in knowledge after the image of its creator. ¹¹ Here there is not Greek and Jew, circumcised and uncircumcised, barbarian, Scythian, slave, free; but Christ is all, and in all.

Consecration to Life — Colossians 3:12-17

¹² Put on then, as God's chosen ones, holy and beloved, compassionate hearts, kindness, humility, meekness, and patience, ¹³ bearing with one another and, if one has a complaint against another, forgiving each other; as the Lord has forgiven you, so you also must forgive. ¹⁴ And above all these put on love, which binds everything together in perfect harmony. ¹⁵ And let the peace of Christ rule in your hearts, to which indeed you were called in one body. And be thankful. ¹⁶ Let the word of Christ dwell in you richly, teaching and admonishing one another in all wisdom, singing psalms and hymns and spiritual songs, with thankfulness in your hearts to God. ¹⁷ And whatever you do, in word or deed, do everything in the name of the Lord Jesus, giving thanks to God the Father through him.



DAILY DEVOTION

Memory Text — Romans 11:33-36 — 33 Oh, the depth of the riches and wisdom and knowledge of God! How unsearchable are his judgments and how inscrutable his ways! 34 "For who has known the mind of the Lord, or who has been his counselor?" 35 "Or who has given a gift to him that he might be repaid?"

Heidelberg Catechism 35: What is the meaning of these words "He was conceived by the Holy Ghost, born of the virgin Mary"? That God's eternal Son, who is, and continues true and eternal God, took upon him the very nature of man, of the flesh and blood of the virgin Mary, by the operation of the Holy Ghost; that he might also be the true seed of David, like unto his brethren in all things, sin excepted.

Monday: Romans 1:1. What three ways is Paul described? What is he emphasizing about himself (contrast Gal 1:1)? What attitude and obligation does "slave of Christ" reveal (1 Cor 1:29, Rom 6:17-18)? What is uniquely true of a NT apostle (Acts 1:21-26, Gal 1:1, 1 Cor 9:1)? Although not apostles, in what ways do we share their calling (Acts 1:8, Mt 28:19f)?

Tuesday: Romans 1:2-3. What is the content of the gospel according to v 3 (Ps 2:7, 2 Sam 7:12-13, Dan 7:13-14)? Is this promise of a king/the gospel new to the NT era (1 Pet 1:10f, Is 53)? Is it man's message (2b, 1 Thess 1:5, 2:13)? God never fails to keep his promises. Think of about a specific promise of God in that light. Why is it significant to you that Jesus was truly human (e.g. Heb 4:15-16)?

Wednesday: Romans 1:4. Jesus was always the Son of God (Ps 2:7). When and why did he become the "Son of God *in power*" (v 5, Acts 1:8, 2:32 -37)? How is Christ's powerful, cosmic rule advanced (Rom 1:16f, 6:1ff, 10:12-17, 12:1-2). Pray that Christ's powerful reign will advance in you, the church, and the community.

Thursday: What are the three goals of the gospel in Rom 1:5? What is the "obedience of [which is] faith" (Rom 4:2, 10:16)? What is the ongoing "obedience of [which springs from] faith" (Rom 6:16, 16:19, 12:9-13)? How must Christ's powerful reign work both of these aspects? In what area to you need to trust Christ more? Where do you need to demonstrate obedience more? Pray for Christ's help in this.

Friday: Rom 1:5c, 6. Who is the gospel for? How is this emphasized? Who is "called to belong to Christ" (1:16, 1 Tim 2:4)? What implications does this have for your prayer life (1 Tim 2:1-3, 7)? For your witnessing life? Pray for a deeper zeal for outreach and evangelism in our church and in your life. How can you grow in this this week?

Saturday: What is Paul zealous for in Romans 1:8-15?
