DAILY DEVOTION

Memory Text — Romans 11:33-36 — ³³ Oh, the depth of the riches and wisdom and knowledge of God! How unsearchable are his judgments and how inscrutable his ways! ³⁴ **“For who has known the mind of the Lord, or who has been his counselor?”**

Heidelberg Catechism 55. What do you understand by “the communion of saints”? First, that all and every one, who believes, being members of Christ, are in common, partakers of him, and of all his riches and gifts; secondly, that every one must know it to be his duty, readily and cheerfully to employ his gifts, for the advantage and salvation of other members.

Monday: Lev 19:33. Have you ever felt like a stranger? What was that it like? Imagine a stranger in all-Jewish Israel (e.g. Ruth). What does Lev 19:33 forbid? What are some ways a stranger can be treated poorly/wrongly? How have you done this with attitudes, actions, words? How does society do this? How does the gospel confront us in this? Pray for change.

Tuesday: What does Lev 19:34 command us (Rom 12:13, 1 Tim 5:10, Heb 13:2) How does “as yourself” fill out the command? See Deut 10:18f for how God treats the stranger. Who are the strangers in your life (church, work, neighborhood, etc)? How can you love Christ by showing them hospitality (Mt 25:36)? Will you?

Wednesday: What is the motive for hospitality given in Lev 19:34 (cf Dt 24:17-18)? How is Jesus the ultimate stranger-lover (hospitality in Greek is ‘stranger-lover’) (see Eph 2:4, 19)? How should these truths help motivate you to practice hospitality? What are a few small ways you can begin to show hospitality?

Thursday: Lev 19:33-34, 1 Pet _____. How is a lack of hospitality contrary to the very nature of God? How does hospitality reflect God’s character? If we do hospitality but are grumbly about it (1 Pet 4:8), what does that reveal about our motivation? How does that grumbly heart cause us to turn back to Wednesday’s question? How can you show hospitality when you are at church?

Friday: Lev 19:33-34. What are the excuses and fears that keep you from obeying this commandment? How do Lev 19:18 and Luke 10:27 argue with those excuses/fears? Pray for help in this. Trust God in it. Remember that God commands this of those who are already his children -so rest in his grace, not in your hospitality-record (or lack thereof). Remember how you have been deeply encouraged by someone else’s hospitality/love.

Saturday: What is the gospel that Paul mentions in Romans 1:1-7?

Invitation to the Lord's Supper

Since it is our privilege today to celebrate the blessed sacrament of the Lord's Supper, we are called to prepare our hearts by rightly examining ourselves.

"Do This in Remembrance of Me," says Jesus as He invites us to His Holy Supper. It is not only a privilege, but also a personal responsibility to respond to this gracious invitation. The apostle Paul alerts us to this responsibility in 1 Corinthians 11:27, "Therefore, whoever eats the bread or drinks the cup of the Lord in an unworthy manner will be guilty of sinning against the body and blood of the Lord." Furthermore, the Lord, through the Apostle Paul also instructs us that those who eat and drink "without recognizing the body of the Lord eats and drinks judgement on himself."

In light of the scriptural teaching, the elders invite you to join in the communion celebration on the basis of the following personal affirmations:

- 1. I confess that I am a sinner and repent of my sins.**
- 2. I have been baptized into the name of the Father, the Son and the Holy Spirit.**
- 3. I believe in Jesus as my Savior and Lord who forgives all my sins because of His sacrifice.**
- 4. I desire to show my thankfulness to God by resolving to live in faith and obedience before my Lord, and in love and peace with my neighbors.**
- 5. I have made a public profession of faith in a church that recognizes the sovereign authority of God's Word and that we are saved only by grace through faith in Jesus Christ.**
- 6. I am a member in good standing in my home church.**

If, for some reason, you do not believe you should partake of communion with God's people at this time, the elders would then urge you to refrain from participating today and they would also urge you to actively seek out either one of the elders or the pastor for further instruction. They are eager and willing to discuss these matters in light of God's Word, as they are called to tend to these matters for the purity of Christ's Church, His Glory, and the good of His people.

We are confident that the Savior accepts us at His table when we come in faith, with sorrow for our sins, and with a will to follow Him as He commands.
