Sermon Text — Romans 1:18-32

¹⁸ For the wrath of God is revealed from heaven against all ungodliness and unrighteousness of men, who by their unrighteousness suppress the truth. ¹⁹ For what can be known about God is plain to them, because God has shown it to them. ²⁰ For his invisible attributes, namely, his eternal power and divine nature, have been clearly perceived, ever since the creation of the world, in the things that have been made. So they are without excuse. ²¹ For although they knew God, they did not honor him as God or give thanks to him, but they became futile in their thinking, and their foolish hearts were darkened. ²² Claiming to be wise, they became fools, ²³ and exchanged the glory of the immortal God for images resembling mortal man and birds and animals and creeping things.

²⁴ Therefore God gave them up in the lusts of their hearts to impurity, to the dishonoring of their bodies among themselves, ²⁵ because they exchanged the truth about God for a lie and worshiped and served the creature rather than the Creator, who is blessed forever! Amen.

²⁶ For this reason God gave them up to dishonorable passions. For their women exchanged natural relations for those that are contrary to nature; ²⁷ and the men likewise gave up natural relations with women and were consumed with passion for one another, men committing shameless acts with men and receiving in themselves the due penalty for their error.
²⁸ And since they did not see fit to acknowledge God, God gave them

²⁸ And since they did not see fit to acknowledge God, God gave them up to a debased mind to do what ought not to be done. ²⁹ They were filled with all manner of unrighteousness, evil, covetousness, malice. They are full of envy, murder, strife, deceit, maliciousness. They are gossips, ³⁰ slanderers, haters of God, insolent, haughty, boastful, inventors of evil, disobedient to parents, ³¹ foolish, faithless, heartless, ruthless. ³² Though they know God's righteous decree that those who practice such things deserve to die, they not only do them but give approval to those who practice them.

DAILY DEVOTION

Memory Text — **Romans 1:17** — ¹⁷ For in it the righteousness of God is revealed from faith for faith, as it is written, "The righteous shall live by faith."

Westminster Confession of Faith 1.1 — Although the light of nature, and the works of creation and providence do so far manifest the goodness, wisdom, and power of God, as to leave men unexcusable; yet are they not sufficient to give that knowledge of God, and of His will, which is necessary unto salvation.

Monday: Compare and contrast Romans 1:17 and 18. What need is revealed in v 18? Why is God's action in v 17 the only solution? What do you think Paul expects your response to these two truths to be (v 15, 3:27, 3:23, 24)? How is this helpful to keep in mind when reading the rest of the chapter (esp v 27, 29-31)?

Tuesday: Rom 1:18-20. What is made known about God through natural revelation (anything created, not the Bible)? How does creation proclaim God's wisdom, glory, power (e.g. Ps 19:1f, Ps 104:27, Acts 14:17)? What does man by nature do with this God-knowledge (v 18b)? Where does this knowledge leave mankind (20)? How can you 'read' the book of creation for God's glory this week?

Wednesday: Rom 1:21-25. Although natural man knows there is a God, what is his 'go to' after the fall (v 25)? How did Adam and Eve do vv 21-23? Everyone is a worshipper. What are some of the 'worshipping the creature' idols of the day? What do you tend to worship (find hope, security, significance in)? How does the work of Christ draw you to worship, repentance, and obedience with a greater love?

Thursday: Rom 1:25-31. False worship leads to disordered desires. What explicit example of a disordered desire does Paul give (26-27)? How do you see disordered sexual desire in our society? What is its cost? Does this justify disdain or mocking such folks (Rom 1:15, 9:3, 1 Cor 6:9-11)? What other disordered desires do vv 29-31 list? How is this list humbling? How does it press us to the "righteousness of God" (v 17)? How will you pray for folks given to vv 26f, 29-31?

Friday: Rom 1:18 talks about God's wrath being revealed in the present. How do you see that in the text, especially in the phrase "gave them up." Does this mean there is no hope for these sinners, or does it underline the only true hope (1:16-17)? Spend some time praying for God's power in the gospel to touch specific unbelievers.

Saturday: How does Paul convict the religious people of unrighteousness deserving God's wrath in Rom 2:1-11?
