Sermon Text — Romans 1:8-15

⁸ First, I thank my God through Jesus Christ for all of you, because your faith is proclaimed in all the world. ⁹ For God is my witness, whom I serve with my spirit in the gospel of his Son, that without ceasing I mention you ¹⁰ always in my prayers, asking that somehow by God's will I may now at last succeed in coming to you. ¹¹ For I long to see you, that I may impart to you some spiritual gift to strengthen you— ¹² that is, that we may be mutually encouraged by each other's faith, both yours and mine. ¹³ I do not want you to be unaware, brothers, that I have often intended to come to you (but thus far have been prevented), in order that I may reap some harvest among you as well as among the rest of the Gentiles. ¹⁴ I am under obligation both to Greeks and to barbarians, both to the wise and to the foolish. ¹⁵ So I am eager to preach the gospel to you also who are in Rome.

DAILY DEVOTION

Memory Text — Romans 11:33-36 — ³³ Oh, the depth of the riches and wisdom and knowledge of God! How unsearchable are his judgments and how inscrutable his ways! ³⁴ “For who has known the mind of the Lord, or who has been his counselor?” ³⁵ “Or who has given a gift to him that he might be repaid?” ³⁶ **For from him and through him and to him are all things. To him be glory forever. Amen.**

Westminster Confession 26.2 Of the Communion of Saints — Saints by profession are bound to maintain a holy fellowship and communion in the worship of God, and in performing such other spiritual services as tend to their mutual edification; as also in relieving each other in outward things, according to their several abilities and necessities. Which communion, as God offers opportunity, is to be extended unto all those who, in every place, call upon the name of the Lord Jesus.

Monday: Rom 1:8. Paul starts with thanksgiving. Why isn't that usually the first thing out of your mouth (especially about fellow saints)? Why does Paul thank God instead of the Romans (Eph 2:8-9)? How is v 8 a part answer to v 5? Practice praising God for the work you see him doing in and through other saints (and even yourself).

Tuesday: Where do you see evidence of Christian love in Rom 1:8-15? How is our shared faith key to loving others (cf Eph 4:1-7)? What happens if we make something other than faith central to our family-bonds (e.g 1 Cor 1:10-13, 3:3, 21, 2 Cor 11:18)? How is the gospel central to this radical love for one another?

Wednesday: Rom 1:11-12. Although we don't know the gift in v 11, what is the purpose of the gift? This 'strengthening' is in depth of faith and obedience (v 5). "Encourage" includes comfort, instruction, exhortation. Do you seek to offer these in your relationships? Do you invite others to do this to you? Why does it take humility to serve others? -to be served by others? Pray and plan to be more Christlike here.

Thursday: Rom 1:13. What kind of harvest does Paul seek to reap in Rome (10:1, 12:1-2)? What is the seed that causes this growth (1:16-17)? Who gives the growth (1 Cor 3:6, 7)? What kind of harvest are you seeking in yourself? your parenting? your relationships? your work? your neighbors? In whose strength?

Friday: Rom 1:14-15. Why is Paul so eager to share the gospel (e.g. 1:3-4, 7, 18, 5:1-2)? How is our obligation to share the gospel the same as Paul? How is it different? Think of 10 ways you can be zealous for missions and evangelism (not all are called to street preaching). Where might you find godly pressure and help to witness? Pray about this and seek to act on it!

Saturday: Rom 1:16-17. How is the gospel the power of God for salvation?
