Sermon Text — Romans 2:1-11

¹Therefore you have no excuse, O man, every one of you who judges. For in passing judgment on another you condemn yourself, because you, the judge, practice the very same things. ²We know that the judgment of God rightly falls on those who practice such things. ³Do you suppose, O man—you who judge those who practice such things and yet do them yourself—that you will escape the judgment of God? ⁴Or do you presume on the riches of his kindness and forbearance and patience, not knowing that God's kindness is meant to lead you to repentance? ⁵But because of your hard and impenitent heart you are storing up wrath for yourself on the day of wrath when God's righteous judgment will be revealed.

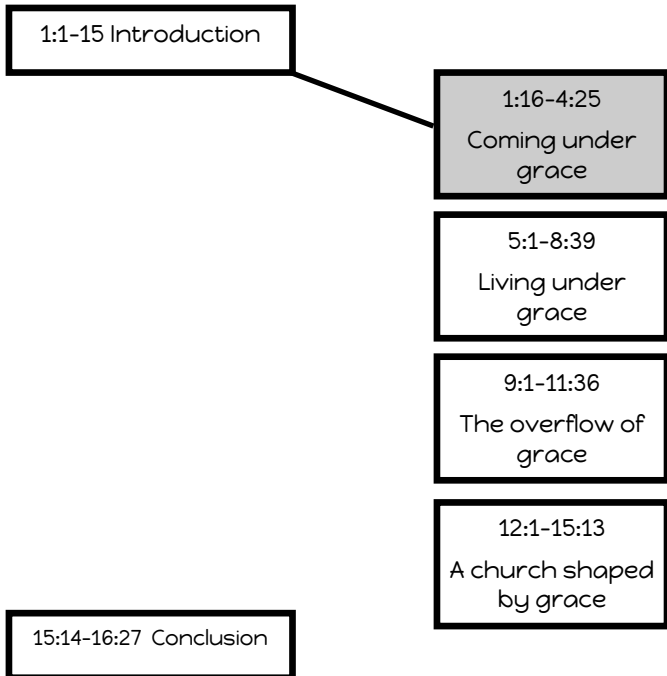

DAILY DEVOTION

Memory Text — Romans 3:20 — ²⁰ For by works of the law no human being will be justified in his sight, since through the law comes knowledge of sin.

Westminster Confession of Faith 33.2 The end of God's appointing this day is for the manifestation of the glory of His mercy, in the eternal salvation of the elect; and of His justice, in the damnation of the reprobate, who are wicked and disobedient. For then shall the righteous go into everlasting life, and receive that fulness of joy and refreshing, which shall come from the presence of the Lord; but the wicked who know not God, and obey not the Gospel of Jesus Christ, shall be cast into eternal torments, and be punished with everlasting destruction from the presence of the Lord, and from the glory of His power.

Monday: Does Rom 2:1-2 forbid *all* judging (Mt 7:5, Jn 7:24)? Are you disgusted at all by Rom 1:26-31? What kind of judging does Romans 2:1-2 forbid? Where do you judge the world's sins while doing similar sins? What about fellow believers? How might a judgment or criticism of yours involve sins of 1:29-30? What does this do to your self-righteousness? Where must you go with all of this?

Tuesday: Rom 2:1-3. How does one's self-righteous or hypocritical judging condemn oneself? Where are you self-condemned (which actions, attitudes, beliefs of others really get to you? How do you justify yourself when you do very similar things?). What is Paul's main point in vv 1-3? How does it underline the desperate need of 1:16-17? Rest in Jesus' righteousness, and your new identity in him.

Wednesday: How does Rom 2:4-5 counter the thought "God must love me because I nothing bad happens when I sin" or "I'm a good, etc"? Why is God patient with his judging (2 Pe 3:9)? What does repentance look like? Why is it a chief characteristic of a Christian? Do you repent of specific sins? How does God's rich kindness, forbearance, patience, draw you to him (cf Mt 27:46)?

Thursday: What is emphasized in Romans v 6, 11? How does that shut the judger up? Although vv 6-7 may seem to point to a works righteousness (contra 3:20), how do they show a life-long life aim, the evidence of a Spirit-touched heart? What is your life aim? Pray for and plan to strengthen your aim in action and attitude.

Friday: Rom 2:8-9. What is the chief aim of the judger, the hypocrite, and the self-righteous? How does it evidence itself (v 8)? What is the just award for a godless (albeit perhaps religious) life? What is Paul driving you to (3:21-26). Use these verses as a personal warning, a prayer for the lost, and a renewed focus on Christ's grace.

Saturday: How does Romans 2:12-29 continue to make the point that all are without excuse? What type of sinner is he convicting in these verses?
