Morning Worship

December 16, 2018

Reflection — As with Jesus' flight into Egypt, Herod's killing of Bethlehem's toddlers fulfills prophecy. Matthew 2:18 quotes from Jeremiah 31:15, a passage describing how the mothers of Israel (personified here in Rachel, matriarch of the nation) mourned when their children, the tribes of Israel, were carried into exile. However, the rest of Jeremiah's chapter is hopeful, predicting a day when God will rescue His people from exile and inaugurate a new covenant. In quoting this passage, Matthew tells us two things. First, in Matthew's day the people are still enduring the suffering of exile even though they are living in their own land. Second, this exile will end with Jesus. The tears of Bethlehem's mothers over their murdered children fill up and end the suffering of exile because the One who will bring in the new covenant has arrived. Herod is one example of all those who have tried to destroy the Christ and His people. Though this evil king did much harm, he was in the end unable to thwart the plans of the Father for His Son.

We too can be sure that even when the church suffers persecution at home and abroad, God's kingdom will never be overcome.



Sermon Text — Matthew 2:16-18, Jeremiah 31:7-26

¹⁶ Then Herod, when he saw that he had been tricked by the wise men, became furious, and he sent and killed all the male children in Bethlehem and in all that region who were two years old or under, according to the time that he had ascertained from the wise men. ¹⁷ Then was fulfilled what was spoken by the prophet Jeremiah:

¹⁸ "A voice was heard in Ramah, weeping and loud lamentation, Rachel weeping for her children;
She refused to be comforted, because

she refused to be comforted, because they are no more."

⁷ For thus says the LORD:

"Sing aloud with gladness for Jacob,

DAILY DEVOTION

Memory Text — **Romans 3:25** — ²³ for all have sinned and fall short of the glory of God, ²⁴ and are justified by his grace as a gift, through the redemption that is in Christ Jesus ²⁵ whom God put forward as a propitiation by his blood, to be received by faith.

Westminster Shorter Catechism 106: What do we pray for in the sixth petition? *In the sixth petition, which is, "And lead us not into temptation, but deliver us from evil,"* we pray, That God would either keep us from being tempted to sin, or support and deliver us when we are tempted.

Monday: Read Ps 2:1-3, Rev 12:1-6. How do you see these texts played out in Mt 2:13-23. How do you see God's protection (Ps 2:4ff) in these same verses? If God so protects his Son, will he not protect his adopted children? Where do you try protect yourself, or be/provide your own security? What would it look like to entrust yourself to God?

Tuesday: Matthew 2:16. What does Herod do? Why? Compare this to Ex 1:21-22. Jesus escapes this time, but does Jesus ultimately escape murder by the ruler (Mt 27:22-26)? How is this hopeful for serious sinners like Herod (Acts 9:1, 17-19, 1 Tim 1:15-16)? Are you beyond Christ's grace? Are you receiving and resting in his forgiveness and love?

Wednesday: Matthew 2:17. Look at Rachel's "prophecy" of tears (Gen 35:18, 37:35, Jer 31:15). In Jer 31:15 she weeps because her people are exiled. Why is she weeping in Mt 2:17? Herod's sin (like Adam's) caused significant suffering. Take a moment and lament the suffering you see around you. This formed part of Christ's suffering (e.g. he fled into exile). How does this help the sufferer (Heb 4:14-16, 2:14-18)? How will Christ ultimately deal with suffering (Rev 21:1-3)?

Thursday: Why does Jer 31:15-16 tell Rachel to stop weeping (see Jer 31:8, 12, 13-14, 25)? How does the birth of Christ underline each of these reasons, and provide deep comfort for those suffering? Pray these verses for yourself or others you know are suffering.

Friday: Herod's destruction of the Bethlehem boys is a dark part of the Christmas story. Yet the passage quoted and fulfilled in Mt 2:16-18 holds the key to hope for serious sinners. How? See Jeremiah 31:7, 9, 11. Confess your sin (Jer 31:17-18). Grieve others' sins, including our nation's. Go to Christ for fresh mercy, and strength to fight sin.

Saturday: Read Matthew 1:18-25. What is the significance of Joseph adopting Jesus?
