Wonderful Counselor, Mighty God, Everlasting Father, Prince of Peace.


⁷ Of the increase of his government and of peace there will be no end,



Sermon Text — Matthew 1:18-25

¹⁸ Now the birth of Jesus Christ took place in this way. When his mother Mary had been betrothed to Joseph, before they came together she was found to be with child from the Holy Spirit. ¹⁹ And her husband Joseph, being a just man and unwilling to put her to shame, resolved to divorce her quietly. ²⁰ But as he considered these things, behold, an angel of the Lord appeared to him in a dream, saying, "Joseph, son of David, do not fear to take Mary as your wife, for that which is conceived in her is from the Holy Spirit. ²¹ She will bear a son, and you shall call his name Jesus, for he will save his people from their sins." ²² All this took place to fulfill what the Lord had spoken by the prophet:

²³ "Behold, the virgin shall conceive and bear a son, and they shall call his name Immanuel"

(which means, God with us).²⁴ When Joseph woke from sleep, he did as the angel of the Lord commanded him: he took his wife,²⁵ but knew her not until she had given birth to a son. And he called his name Jesus.

DAILY DEVOTION

Memory Text — **Romans 3:25a** — ²³ for all have sinned and fall short of the glory of God, ²⁴ and are justified by his grace as a gift, through the redemption that is in Christ Jesus ²⁵ whom God put forward as a propitiation by his blood, to be received by faith. This was to show God's right-eousness, because in his divine forbearance he had passed over former sins.

Heidelberg Catechism 35. What is the meaning of these words "He was conceived by the Holy Spirit, born of the virgin Mary"? That God's eternal Son, who is, and continues true and eternal God, took upon himself the very nature of man, of the flesh and blood of the virgin Mary, by the operation of the Holy Spirit; that he might also be the true seed of David, like his brothers in all things, sin excepted

Monday: Read Mt 1:18-25. How much press does Jesus' actual birth get? How is this refreshingly simple? What stands out because of this simplicity? How do these verses set Jesus' mission? What do these verses call you to meditate on in this season (Lk 1:77)?

Tuesday: Find all the proofs you can of Christ's divinity in Mt 1:18-25. Compare this to John 1:1-4, 14, Phil 2:6-8. J.C. Ryle says "If we would have a strong foundation for our faith and hope, we must keep constantly in view our Savior's *divinity*." How does Christ's divinity set a strong foundation for our faith and hope (i.e. Heb 7:25)?

Wednesday: How does Matthew emphasize Jesus' humanity in Mt 1:18-25? Why must Christ be truly human (see catechism above)? How is his humanity a rich comfort for us? How does it give us confidence to approach Christ? See Heb 2:17-18, 4:15.

Thursday: Read Mt 1:21. What does "Jesus" mean? "Sinners" in v 21 seems to look back to the genealogy. Ponder the sinners in Mt 1:1-16. What kind of Savior were the Jews expecting? How do we reflect the same (shallow) deliverances? How is it helpful (useful, necessary) to keep in the forefront that we are sinners in need of a Savior?

Friday: Matthew 1:22 says "all this" took place to fulfill Is 7:14. Is he talking only about the virgin conception? Trace Isaiah's development of Immanuel through Is 7:14, 8:8-10, 8:13-14, 9:6f, 11:1-5. Spend a moment marveling that through Christ's salvation work God is with us even to the end of the age.

Saturday: Matthew 2:1-12. Why do you think Matthew includes the story of the Wise Men in his gospel?
