Therefore God exalted Him to the place of highest praises And He gave Him a name above every name That at the very name of Jesus, Son of God


So in heav'n and earth and below every knee would bow In worship and ev'ry tongue would proclaim That Jesus, He reigns with the angels


Old Testament Reading — Isaiah 11:1-5

in the house of his servant David,


⁷⁰ as he spoke by the mouth of his holy prophets from of old,
