# Sermon Text — Romans 3:27-4:12

<sup>27</sup> Then what becomes of our boasting? It is excluded. By what kind of law? By a law of works? No, but by the law of faith. <sup>28</sup> For we hold that one is justified by faith apart from works of the law. <sup>29</sup> Or is God the God of Jews only? Is he not the God of Gentiles also? Yes, of Gentiles also, <sup>30</sup> since God is one—who will justify the circumcised by faith and the uncircumcised through faith. <sup>31</sup> Do we then overthrow the law by this faith? By no means! On the contrary, we uphold the law.

**4** What then shall we say was gained by Abraham, our forefather according to the flesh? <sup>2</sup> For if Abraham was justified by works, he has something to boast about, but not before God. <sup>3</sup> For what does the Scripture say? "Abraham believed God, and it was counted to him as righteousness." <sup>4</sup> Now to the one who works, his wages are not counted as a gift but as his due. <sup>5</sup> And to the one who does not work but believes in him who justifies the ungodly, his faith is counted as righteousness, <sup>6</sup> just as David also speaks of the blessing of the one to whom God counts righteousness apart from works:

<sup>7</sup> "Blessed are those whose lawless deeds are forgiven, and whose sins are covered;

<sup>8</sup> blessed is the man against whom the Lord will not count his sin."

<sup>9</sup> Is this blessing then only for the circumcised, or also for the uncircumcised? For we say that faith was counted to Abraham as righteousness. <sup>10</sup> How then was it counted to him? Was it before or after he had been circumcised? It was not after, but before he was circumcised. <sup>11</sup> He received the sign of circumcision as a seal of the righteousness that he had by faith while he was still uncircumcised. The purpose was to make him the father of all who believe without being circumcised, so that righteousness would be counted to them as well, <sup>12</sup> and to make him the father of the circumcised who are not merely circumcised but who also walk in the footsteps of the faith that our father Abraham had before he was circumcised.





#### **DAILY DEVOTION**

**Westminster Confession 11.3 Of Justification** — Christ, by His obedience and death, did fully discharge the debt of all those that are thus justified, and did make a proper, real and full satisfaction to His Father's justice in their behalf. Yet, in as much as He was given by the Father for them; and His obedience and satisfaction accepted in their stead; and both, freely, not for any thing in them; their justification is only of free grace; that both the exact justice, and rich grace of God might be glorified in the justification of sinners.

**Monday:** Rom 3:27-28. What is boasting? What is the heart attitude under boasting? Think about specific moments in which you compare, think your way is better, consider yourself superior, get a sparkle in your eye. Why does justification by faith alone in Christ alone (3:24f) exclude all boasting and produce deep humility (cf Gal 6:14-16, 1 Cor 1:31)?

**Tuesday**: Rom 3:29-31. When we see ourselves superior because we are or do something better than someone else, what are we saying about the basis for God's favor? What does v 30 say is always the basis for God's favor? How must this be true if God is one (perfect consistent and integrity, cf Deut 6:4, Rom 2:6, 11)? How can this truth help you fight boasting, self-importance, self-exaltation?

**Wednesday:** Rom 4:1-5. The Jews believed God favored/blessed Abraham (and them) because he was circumcised and obeyed. What comes first in Genesis, Abraham's "believed God and it was counted as righteousness" or his circumcision (Gen 15:6, 17:11)? How does v 4 underline how one is was justified? Praise God for this. How does this truth change your view of those (especially in the church) who eat, spend, dress, look, live differently than you?

**Thursday:** Rom 4:6-8. All Old Testament saints were saved by faith alone, not by works. What does v 6 say about David? Who does the action in Psalm 32:1-2/Rom 4:7-8? How does Paul pick up on the word "count" from Ps 32 (Rom 4:3, 4, 5, 6)? V 6 says "God counts *righteousness.*" He credits Christ's righteousness to you instead of your sins, so you are his beloved child. Ponder that blessing until your heart is joyous.

**Friday:** The point of Rom 4:9-12 is that you have no reason to boast because Abraham is the father of one unified church -unified by the free grace of God in Christ alone. What does Paul say circumcision points to and confirms (v 11)? While Abraham was still a Gentile/uncircumcised, he had this faith (v 11), so he is the father of gentiles believers. How is he also the father of the circumcised (v 12)? How does v 12 qualify that this isn't simply national Jews? If you are a member of the church by God's free generosity, how must Phil 2:1-4 mark you more? Where will you implement this?

**Saturday:** Paul's second application of justification by faith alone is assurance. How does Rom 4:13-25 give you firm ground for assurance of salvation?
