

Sermon Text — 1 Peter 5:1-4

So I exhort the elders among you, as a fellow elder and a witness of the sufferings of Christ, as well as a partaker in the glory that is going to be revealed: ² shepherd the flock of God that is among you, exercising oversight, not under compulsion, but willingly, as God would have you; not for shameful gain, but eagerly; ³ not domineering over those in your charge, but being examples to the flock. ⁴ And when the chief Shepherd appears, you will receive the unfading crown of glory. ⁵ Likewise, you who are younger, be subject to the elders. Clothe yourselves, all of you, with humility toward one another, for "God opposes the proud but gives grace to the humble."

DAILY DEVOTION

Memory Verse: Romans 5:2 — ² Through him we have also obtained access by faith into this grace in which we stand, and we rejoice in hope of the glory of God.

Westminster Larger Catechism 83 What is the communion in glory with Christ which the members of the invisible church enjoy in this life? *The members of the invisible church have communicated to them in this life the firstfruits of glory with Christ, as they are members of him their head, and so in him are interested in that glory which he is fully possessed of; and, as an earnest thereof, enjoy the sense of God's love, peace of conscience, joy in the Holy Ghost, and hope of glory....*

Monday: Read 1 Pet 5:1-5. How many times does “glory” appear? Look for “glory” in 4:13, 14, 5:10. What is the glory of Christ (cf 1 Pet 1:8, 11)? Does the glory of Christ, and its full manifestation at his return charm you? How does it comfort, give hope, and stability in times of suffering and trial (Rom 8:18, 2 Cor 4:14-18)?

Tuesday: 1 Pet 5:1. What kinds of suffering and temptation are you facing? How can suffering be a hindrance to seeing and savoring the glory of Christ (5:8-9)? How can suffering produce or strengthen a greater savoring of Christ's glory (4:12-18, 19)? What sufferings did Peter witness (2:19-25)? How does the fact that Christ suffered help you in suffering (1 Pet 2:10)? What did Christ's sufferings lead to (Phil 2:8-9)?

Wednesday: What is Peter's (surprising) solution to suffering in 1 Pet 5:1-3? What must these men also have tasted according to v 1 (cf Monday's question)? What does the Chief Shepherd appoint these elders to do (v 2)? How can that help in times of suffering and temptation? Pray for our elders: for them personally and spiritually, their shepherding and leading work, and your attitude toward them.

Thursday: How does a focus on the glory of the Chief Shepherd correct each of the things Peter warns about in 1 Pet 5:2-4? How did Christ exemplify each of them? How do you struggle with parallel things? Put them into the focus of the glory of Christ. What motivation does Christ give to the elders (4)? Why? Pray through these verses for our elders.

Friday: What two commands does Peter give in 1 Pet 5:5? Why might younger people especially need a reminder to be subject to the elders (and parents)? Why is this tough for all of us? Why is it needed (Heb 13:17)? What is the whole church's responsibility, not just to elders, but to one another? Why does God oppose pride (Prov 3:34, Rom 1:24f)? Where do you struggle with this? Pray for help, and fight against this pride.

Saturday: How does Rom 6:1-14 tie in with the theme of Romans (1:16-17)?

Questions for the candidate:

1. Do you believe the Scriptures of the Old and New Testaments to be the Word of God, the only infallible rule of faith and practice?
2. Do you sincerely receive and adopt the Confession of Faith and Catechisms of this Church, as containing the system of doctrine taught in the Holy Scriptures?
3. Do you approve of the government, discipline, and worship of the Orthodox Presbyterian Church?
4. Do you promise to seek the purity, the peace, and the unity of the church?
5. Do you accept the office of ruling elder in this congregation and promise, in reliance on the grace of God, faithfully to perform all the duties thereof?

Question for the Congregation:

Do you, the members of this church, acknowledge and receive this brother as a ruling elder, and do you promise to yield him all that honor, encouragement, and obedience in the Lord, to which his office, according to the Word of God and the constitution of this Church, entitles him?
