Assurance of Pardon — Hebrews 11:8-12

⁸ By faith Abraham obeyed when he was called to go out to a place that he was to receive as an inheritance. And he went out, not knowing where he was going. ⁹ By faith he went to live in the land of promise, as in a foreign land, living in tents with Isaac and Jacob, heirs with him of the same promise. ¹⁰ For he was looking forward to the city that has foundations, whose designer and builder is God. ¹¹ By faith Sarah herself received power to conceive, even when she was past the age, since she considered him faithful who had promised. ¹² Therefore from one man, and him as good as dead, were born descendants as many as the stars of heaven and as many as the innumerable grains of sand by the seashore.

Sermon Text — Romans 4:13-25

¹³ For the promise to Abraham and his offspring that he would be heir of the world did not come through the law but through the righteousness of faith. ¹⁴ For if it is the adherents of the law who are to be the heirs, faith is null and the promise is void. ¹⁵ For the law brings wrath, but where there is no law there is no transgression.

¹⁶ That is why it depends on faith, in order that the promise may rest on grace and be guaranteed to all his offspring-not only to the adherent of the law but also to the one who shares the faith of Abraham, who is the father of us all, ¹⁷ as it is written, "I have made you the father of many nations"—in the presence of the God in whom he believed, who gives life to the dead and calls into existence the things that do not exist. ¹⁸ In hope he believed against hope, that he should become the father of many nations, as he had been told, "So shall your offspring be." 19 He did not weaken in faith when he considered his own body, which was as good as dead (since he was about a hundred years old), or when he considered the barrenness of Sarah's womb. 20 No unbelief made him waver concerning the promise of God, but he grew strong in his faith as he gave glory to God, ²¹ fully convinced that God was able to do what he had promised. ²² That is why his faith was "counted to him as righteousness." ²³ But the words "it was counted to him" were not written for his sake alone, ²⁴ but for ours also. It will be counted to us who believe in him who raised from the dead Jesus our Lord, ²⁵ who was delivered up for our trespasses and raised for our justification.

DAILY DEVOTION

Romans 4:4-5 — ⁴ Now to the one who works, his wages are not counted as a gift but as his due. ⁵ And to the one who does not work but believes in him who justifies the ungodly, his faith is counted as righteousness...

Westminster Confession 18.2 Of Assurance This certainty is not a bare conjectural and probable persuasion grounded upon a fallible hope; but an infallible assurance of faith founded upon the divine truth of the promises of salvation, the inward evidence of those graces unto which these promises are made, the testimony of the Spirit of adoption witnessing with our spirits that we are the children of God, which Spirit is the earnest of our inheritance, whereby we are sealed to the day of redemption.

Monday: Rom 4:13 mentions a promise to Abraham. What 3 parts were there to this promise (Gen 15:6; 7; Gen 12:3)? What challenge to Abraham excluded his ability to work for this promise (Gen 15:3, Rom 4:19)? How is each part of this promise fulfilled in Christ (Rom 4:16f; Heb 11:10, 16; Gal 3:14)? How is our inheriting the world (Mt 5, Eph 3:6) the pinnacle of being Christ's (e.g. Rev 21:1-3, Phil 3:7-11)?


Tuesday: Rom 4:13-15. Why does the law bring wrath (Rom 1:19, 3:20, 23)? When people read the law, they become more guilty because they now sin knowingly (v 15b). If the law only brings wrath, how can it possibly bring blessing? Why does law-keeping for blessing wreak havoc on assurance? Where have you seen this in others? In yourself? What alternative does Paul argue for (v 13, 16)?

Wednesday: What basis for the promise to Abraham (of righteousness, eternal blessedness) does Paul give in Rom 4:16-17? If the promise rests on grace, can faith be a work we have to do? How does the fact that the promise "depends not at all on human initiative, privilege, religion, morality, knowledge, response, but grace" make it sure, secure, guaranteed? How does this assure you of God's favor and love?

Thursday: How is God's power emphasized in Rom 4:17-18, 21? How does God's omnipotence underline the surety/guarantee of the promise God made? How does such power give Abraham hope when, humanly speaking, there was no hope? Where is Abraham looking for assurance of God's love, grace, forgiveness, eternal life? Where are you looking?

Friday: Rom 4:20-21 says Abraham didn't waver in faith. Look at Gen 16:2f, 17:17. How does it comfort you that while Abraham wavered, God can say he didn't because of his overall life-direction? Rom 4:23-25. How is Jesus' death and then resurrection the best guarantee that God has fulfilled his promise that our sins are forgiven, we are raised to new life? Your status and identity are 100% secure, 100% by grace in Christ. Where do you need to rest more fully in it?

Saturday: Read Romans 5:1-11. Ponder verse two's phrase "this grace in which we stand."
