Sermon Text — Romans 6:15-23

¹⁵ What then? Are we to sin because we are not under law but under grace? By no means! ¹⁶ Do you not know that if you present yourselves to anyone as obedient slaves, you are slaves of the one whom you obey, either of sin, which leads to death, or of obedience, which leads to righteousness? ¹⁷ But thanks be to God, that you who were once slaves of sin have become obedient from the heart to the standard of teaching to which you were committed, ¹⁸ and, having been set free from sin, have become slaves of righteousness. ¹⁹ I am speaking in human terms, because of your natural limitations. For just as you once presented your members as slaves to impurity and to lawlessness leading to more lawlessness, so now present your members as slaves to righteousness leading to sanctification.

²⁰ For when you were slaves of sin, you were free in regard to right-eousness. ²¹ But what fruit were you getting at that time from the things of which you are now ashamed? For the end of those things is death. ²² But now that you have been set free from sin and have become slaves of God, the fruit you get leads to sanctification and its end, eternal life. ²³ For the wages of sin is death, but the free gift of God is eternal life in Christ Jesus our Lord.



DAILY DEVOTION

Memory Verse: Romans 6:16 — ¹⁶ Do you not know that if you present yourselves to anyone as obedient slaves, you are slaves of the one whom you obey, either of sin, which leads to death, or of obedience, which leads to righteousness?

Westminster Confession 9.4 — When God converts a sinner, and translates him into the state of grace, He frees him from his natural bondage under sin; and, by His grace alone, enables him freely to will and to do that which is spiritually good; yet so, as that by reason of his remaining corruption, he does not perfectly, or only, will that which is good, but does also will that which is evil.

Monday: Rom 6:14-15. Sin can't condemn you (6:1-14). 6:14 says you are no longer under the law. You're free! But if you take away threats, consequences, and the 'you must obey the rules of conduct,' isn't sin'disobedience going to flourish? How can being "under grace" be any use for holy living? How would you answer that? What is The Enforcer of obedience in your life (e.g rules, guilt, threats, fear of consequences)?

Tuesday: Rom 6:16-19. Describe the Slave-Master relationship. How is sin like a bad Master (16, 19)? If you show up every morning to obey Master-Sin, what does that say about your allegiance? Since that's not who you are now (6:2, 6-8), who should you show up every morning to obey instead? Apply this thinking to a particular sin of yours.

Wednesday: Rom 6:17-19. Who is doing the action in vv 17-18 (all verbs are passives)? Who freed us from Master Sin? How complete is our new status? Our new allegiance is to Master God (v 22). But the motive of our obedience is very different "-from the heart" (17). What is the difference between "heart" obedience and "duty" obedience? How does the type of Master make all the difference (think about the passives or look at 5:1-2, 5)?

Thursday: Rom 6:19b is Paul's main application. Ponder how good and loving your new Master is. Imagine waking up and presenting yourself to him because you love him and want to please him (Rom 12:1-3). How does that help you live righteously? Daily present your *thoughts* to gladly obey your new loving Master. And your *words*. Your *eyes*. Your *stomach*. Your *hands*. Your *sexuality*. Our joy is to please Him!

Friday: Rom 6:20-23. How does Paul strengthen your desire to please God by contrasting the *fruit* of Master Sin and Master Righteousness (21-22)? How does he deepen his argument by contrasting their end results? Although we will fail in holy living, how does v 23's "in Christ" remind us of our secure position in Christ, and the guarantee of eternal life? How does that too motivate you unto obedience?

Saturday: Why must we die to our relationship to the law as the path to right standing with God (Rom 7:1-6)?
