

Affirmation of Faith — Romans 8:18-39

¹⁸ For I consider that the sufferings of this present time are not worth comparing with the glory that is to be revealed to us. ¹⁹ For the creation waits with eager longing for the revealing of the sons of God. ²⁰ For the creation was subjected to futility, not willingly, but because of him who subjected it, in hope ²¹ that the creation itself will be set free from its bondage to corruption and obtain the freedom of the glory of the children of God. ²² For we know that the whole creation has been groaning together in the pains of childbirth until now. ²³ And not only the creation, but we ourselves, who have the firstfruits of the Spirit, groan inwardly as we wait eagerly for adoption as sons, the redemption of our bodies. ²⁴ For in this hope we were saved. Now hope that is seen is not hope. For who hopes for what he sees? ²⁵ But if we hope for what we do not see, we wait for it with patience.

²⁶ Likewise the Spirit helps us in our weakness. For we do not know what to pray for as we ought, but the Spirit himself intercedes for us with groanings too deep for words. ²⁷ And he who searches hearts knows what is the mind of the Spirit, because the Spirit intercedes for the saints according to the will of God. ²⁸ And we know that for those who love God all things work together for good, for those who are called according to his purpose. ²⁹ For those whom

he foreknew he also predestined to be conformed to the image of his Son, in order that he might be the firstborn among many brothers. ³⁰ And those whom he predestined he also called, and those whom he called he also justified, and those whom he justified he also glorified.

³¹ What then shall we say to these things? **If God is for us, who can be against us?** ³² **He who did not spare his own Son but gave him up for us all, how will he not also with him graciously give us all things?** ³³ Who shall bring any charge against God's elect? It is God who justifies. ³⁴ Who is to condemn? Christ Jesus is the one who died—more than that, who was raised—who is at the right hand of God, who indeed is interceding for us. ³⁵ Who shall separate us from the love of Christ? Shall tribulation, or distress, or persecution, or famine, or nakedness, or danger, or sword? ³⁶ As it is written,

"For your sake we are being killed all the day long; we are regarded as sheep to be slaughtered."

³⁷ No, in all these things we are more than conquerors through him who loved us. ³⁸ For I am sure that neither death nor life, nor angels nor rulers, nor things present nor things to come, nor powers, ³⁹ nor height nor depth, nor anything else in all creation, will be able to separate us from the love of God in Christ Jesus our Lord.

DAILY DEVOTION

Memory Verse: Romans 6:18 — ¹⁷ But thanks be to God, that you who were once slaves of sin have become obedient from the heart to the standard of teaching to which you were committed, ¹⁸ and, having been set free from sin, have become slaves of righteousness.

Westminster Larger Catechism 27: Wherein did Christ's humiliation consist? Christ's humiliation consisted in his being born, and that in a low condition, made under the law, undergoing the miseries of this life, the wrath of God, and the cursed death of the cross; in being buried, and continuing under the power of death for a time.

Monday: How does Ps 13 invite you to be frank with God? What is the believer's expectation about God's face/presence (v 1, Num 6:24-26, Ps 11:7, 17:15, 27:4). What is David's problem in v 1, and how is he feeling? Can you relate to this? Think about others who may be groaning like this. Groan to the Lord in prayer (Rom 8:23).

Tuesday: Ps 13:2. What is the inner struggle for David in v 2? What kinds of things give you anxiety, fear, worry, or turn over and over in your mind? What kinds of enemies could v 2 refer to (1 Pet 5:8, Jn 15:19, Rom 7:23)? Spend some time lamenting these things (for you and others) before the Lord. Peak at Rom 8:22-24.

Wednesday: How do vv 3-4 pick up the 3 struggles of vv 1-2? How does David argue with God in prayer (plead God's character, promises, give good reasons for God to answer him)? Think about how you can strengthen specific prayer requests this way, and then pray this way (perhaps use the Lord's Prayer as a basis for argumentation, or Ps 103).

Thursday: What is faith's anchor in Ps 13:5a? This "steadfast love" is God's covenant love. Read about its commitment, endurance, depth, and fulfillment (Ex 34:5-7, 10; Ps 103:17, Eph 3:17-19, Jn 15:13 and Lk 22:20). Although it does not stop all groaning and tears, how does this anchor strengthen and steady you in "how long" times (Rom 8: 31-39, Lam 3:21-24)?

Friday: Salvation in v 5 is likely when vv 3-4 are answered. What does "dealt bountifully" say about God? When is the ultimate fulfillment of "dealt bountifully"? The "shall rejoice" and "will sing" can be taken as future (after salvation is received), or as a wish (let me rejoice). As you ponder this Psalm, and especially God's steadfast love, what response is God calling from you?

Saturday: Pray for the Spirit's powerful work through the preaching of Rom 7:7-12 tomorrow.
