




### Call to Worship — 1 Peter 1:3-5



<sup>13</sup> Therefore, preparing your minds for action, and being sober-minded, set your hope fully on the grace that will be brought to you at the revelation of Jesus Christ. <sup>14</sup> As obedient children, do not be conformed to the passions of your former ignorance, <sup>15</sup> but as he who called you is holy, you also be holy in all your conduct, <sup>16</sup> since it is written, "You shall be holy, for I am holy." <sup>17</sup> And if you call on him as Father who judges impartially according to each one's deeds, conduct yourselves with fear throughout the time of your exile, <sup>18</sup> knowing that you were ransomed from the futile ways inherited from your forefathers, not with perishable things such as silver or gold, <sup>19</sup> but with the precious blood of Christ, like that of a lamb without blemish or spot.

## Sermon Text — Romans 6:1-14

What shall we say then? Are we to continue in sin that grace may abound? <sup>2</sup> By no means! How can we who died to sin still live in it? <sup>3</sup> Do you not know that all of us who have been baptized into Christ Jesus were baptized into his death? <sup>4</sup> We were buried therefore with him by baptism into death, in order that, just as Christ was raised from the dead by the glory of the Father, we too might walk in newness of life.

<sup>5</sup> For if we have been united with him in a death like his, we shall certainly be united with him in a resurrection like his. <sup>6</sup> We know that our old self was crucified with him in order that the body of sin might be brought to nothing, so that we would no longer be enslaved to sin. <sup>7</sup> For one who has died has been set free from sin. <sup>8</sup> Now if we have died with Christ, we believe that we will also live with him. <sup>9</sup> We know that Christ, being raised from the dead, will never die again; death no longer has dominion over him. <sup>10</sup> For the death he died he died to sin, once for all, but the life he lives he lives to God. <sup>11</sup> So you also must consider yourselves dead to sin and alive to God in Christ Jesus.

<sup>12</sup> Let not sin therefore reign in your mortal body, to make you obey its passions. <sup>13</sup> Do not present your members to sin as instruments for unrighteousness, but present yourselves to God as those who have been brought from death to life, and your members to God as instruments for righteousness. <sup>14</sup> For sin will have no dominion over you, since you are not under law but under grace.



## DAILY DEVOTION

**Memory Verse: Romans 6:14** — *For sin will have no dominion over you, since you are not under law but under grace*

**Westminster Confession of Faith, Chapter XIII, Of Sanctification** — *They who are effectually called and regenerated, having a new heart and a new spirit created in them, are further sanctified, really and personally, through the virtue of Christ's death and resurrection, by his Word and Spirit dwelling in them; the dominion of the whole body of sin is destroyed, and the several lusts thereof are more and more weakened and mortified, and they more and more quickened and strengthened, in all saving graces, to the practice of true holiness, without which no man shall see the Lord.*

---

**Monday:** Romans 6:1,2. What is Paul objecting to in this question (v.1; Rom. 3:8; 6:15; 7:4)? How do you sometimes live like verse 1 and not like verse 2? What does this say about how you view your conversion? How does God see you after your conversion (v.2)? How does Paul answer his own question (v.2)?

**Tuesday:** Romans 6:3,4. Is Paul *exhorting* you (Do not sin!) or *explaining a fact* to you (Do you not know...)? After being cleansed from sin what does the Scripture tell us are our new clothes (covering) (see Gal 3:27)? What of your old self have you not seen as dead already?

**Wednesday:** Rom. 6:5-10. Why is it crucial to your life today that Jesus actually died and rose again (v. 5-10)? What comfort does this bring you in your fight against sin (v.6)? To what eternal hope does this point us ultimately (v.5,8)? Give thanks today for the victory that Christ won and give thanks that He has called you to share in His life (Rom 6:22).

**Thursday:** Rom. 6:11. How does the way we view ourselves even after conversion affect the way we live our life? Consider if you applied Romans 6:2-11 more fully to your life how you might live differently. Why is it crucial to your maturity in Christ to immerse yourself in God's Word and the preaching of it (Rom. 10:17; Gal. 3:2)?

**Friday:** Rom. 6:12-14. How does Paul's explanation serve as a warning against allowing sin a foothold in your life (v.12a)? If we do allow sin a place in our life, who then are we really serving (v.12b)? What *negative* command does Paul give us in light of all the truth he has laid out in the preceding verses (v.13a)? What *positive* command are we to obey (v.13b)? What does Paul tell us is the basis for this command he gives (v.14)? How can placing your faith and hope in Christ set you free from trying to perform?

**Saturday:** tomorrow's sermon: Romans 6:15-23. Pray to see concrete ways you can practice being a slave to righteousness.
