Sermon Text — Romans 8:1-8

¹There is therefore now no condemnation for those who are in Christ Jesus. ²For the law of the Spirit of life has set you free in Christ Jesus from the law of sin and death. ³For God has done what the law, weakened by the flesh, could not do. By sending his own Son in the likeness of sinful flesh and for sin, he condemned sin in the flesh, ⁴in order that the righteous requirement of the law might be fulfilled in us, who walk not according to the flesh but according to the Spirit. ⁵For those who live according to the flesh set their minds on the things of the flesh, but those who live according to the Spirit set their minds on the things of the Spirit. ⁶For to set the mind on the flesh is death, but to set the mind on the Spirit is life and peace. ⁷For the mind that is set on the flesh is hostile to God, for it does not submit to God's law; indeed, it cannot. ⁸Those who are in the flesh cannot please God.

DAILY DEVOTION

Memory Verse: Romans 8:1 — There is therefore now no condemnation for those who are in Christ Jesus.

Westminster Confession 19.6 Although true believers be not under the law, as a covenant of works, to be thereby justified, or condemned; yet is it of great use to them, as well as to others; in that, as a rule of life informing them of the will of God, and their duty, it directs and binds them to walk accordingly....

Monday: “Condemnation” is only used in Rom 8:1 and Rom 5:16, 18. How does Rom 5 inform 8:1? Does “no condemnation” mean people can’t confront us with sin (Mt 18:15ff vs Rom 8:39)? When you sin or fail (8:21-24), how are you tempted to respond? How does 8:1 press you in the opposite direction?

Tuesday: Rom 8:1-4. What could the law not do because of our indwelling sin (8:3, 7)? What did God do to resolve this (v 3, Rom 3:25)? Marvel over that. Since believers are united to Christ, how is the righteous requirement of the law fulfilled in them (5:18-19, 2 Cor 5:21)? How do these verses cement God’s forgiveness, acceptance, love for you? How can you use this when you fail and/or sin?

Wednesday: Rom 8:5-8. To “set your mind” is to be intent on, aim, be absorbed with. Find all Paul say about those who “set their minds on the thing of the flesh (sin, sinful stuff)”? How do you get from being “in the flesh” to being “in Christ” (Rom 3:28, 4:1-5)? Pray for individuals who don’t know Christ. Pray for missionaries. Pray that your life-aim is set more on Christ.

Thursday: Rom 8:5-8 are to deeply encourage us when we fail and/or sin. Are we left alone? How near is our Helper? Can we be forsaken? Who is working change in us (despite our weakness)? Who and what does the Spirit point us to when we struggle (Rom 8:1, 10, 14, 15, 16)? Amazing, isn’t it?

Friday: Good Friday is a day we remember our sin and Christ’s sacrifice. Easter is a day we remember our hope and Christ’s resurrection. Read Romans 7:24 to 8:11 with that in mind. Did it lead you to worship? Sing/listen to a hymn or song that will press these truths to your heart.

Saturday: Read Rom 8:9-11. How does Paul tie the Spirit to Easter, as well as to your sanctification?
