²³ For all have sinned and fall short of the glory of God,





DAILY DEVOTION

Memory Verse: Romans 8:2 — There is therefore now no condemnation for those who are in Christ Jesus.² **For the law of the Spirit of life has set you free in Christ Jesus from the law of sin and death.**

Heidelberg Catechism 45 What does the “resurrection” of Christ profit us? First, by his resurrection he has overcome death, that he might make us partakers of that righteousness which he had purchased for us by his death; secondly, we are also by his power raised up to a new life; and lastly, the resurrection of Christ is a sure pledge of our blessed resurrection.

Monday: Where do you see the three persons of the Trinity in Rom 8:9-11? What are they doing? What does the “in you” of v 9 and 10 tell you about the intimate connection between the persons of the Trinity? Marvel at their perfect cooperation, including how they work in concert for your salvation. How can this strengthen your assurance?

Tuesday: Rom 8:9-11. According to these verses, does every believer have the Holy Spirit (see 8:7-8, Acts 2:38)? Does the Spirit dwell in you? Is your heart engaged, or is your Christianity merely head knowledge? How does Rom 8:1-11 continually tie the Spirit to Christ and his work? Pray for a deepening presence and reliance on the Spirit.

Wednesday: Rom 8:9-11 What does the word “dwell” mean? How does the fact that the Spirit “dwells” in believers from their conversion onward bolster your assurance? If the Spirit dwells in you, how (and where) does that encourage you to walk worthy of God? How does this truth bind you value your (and others’) body (1 Cor 6:15, 19)?

Thursday: Rom 8:11 says God (the Father -1 Cor 6:14) raised Jesus from the dead. How does tying the Spirit closely to the Father underline the Spirit’s power? Read Rom 15:13, 1 Cor 2:4, Eph 3:16 on the Spirit’s power. If the powerful Spirit dwells in you, how does this strengthen your confidence about God’s love in Christ for you, and his work in your sanctification (Phil 1:6, 2 Cor 12:10)?

Friday: The main point of Rom 8:11 is our future resurrection. What is the “then” that answers the “if the Spirit dwells in you”? What is its guarantee? How is this a lighthouse of hope for our faltering sanctification (1 Jn 3:2-3)? What is the “end goal” of our justification? Who is working this in us? How should this mark us with confidence, happiness, and increased holiness?

Saturday: Read Rom 8:12-17. What is the difference between at the spirit of slavery and the spirit of sonship?
