¹⁵ As it is said, "Today, if you hear his voice, do not harden your hearts as in the rebellion."

Sermon Text — Romans 8:12-17

¹² So then, brothers, we are debtors, not to the flesh, to live according to the flesh. ¹³ For if you live according to the flesh you will die, but if by the Spirit you put to death the deeds of the body, you will live. ¹⁴ For all who are led by the Spirit of God are sons of God. ¹⁵ For you did not receive the spirit of slavery to fall back into fear, but you have received the Spirit of adoption as sons, by whom we cry, "Abba! Father!" ¹⁶ The Spirit himself bears witness with our spirit that we are children of God, ¹⁷ and if children, then heirs—heirs of God and fellow heirs with Christ, provided we suffer with him in order that we may also be glorified with him.

DAILY DEVOTION

Memory Verse: Romans 8:14 "For all who are led by the Spirit of God are sons of God"

Westminster Confession, WSC Question 36 — What are the benefits which in this life do accompany or flow from justification, adoption, and sanctification? A: The benefits which in this life do accompany or flow from justification, adoption, and sanctification, are, assurance of God's love, peace of conscience, joy in the Holy Ghost, increase of grace, and perseverance therein to the end.

Monday: Rom. 8:12 "So then, brothers, we are debtors, not to the flesh, to live according to the flesh". To Whom, then, are we in debt? What is it that we now "owe" (cf. Rom. 13:8)? How is it possible to "pay this debt" now that we are in Christ? Look at Matt. 18:23-35 for just one example of a debt we can pay through the Spirit's work in us.

Tuesday: Rom. 8:15 "For you did not receive the spirit of slavery to fall back into fear, but you have received the Spirit of Adoption as sons, by whom we cry, "Abba, Father!" How is it possible to call God our Father? What does that say about how He sees us when we are in distress or have sinned against Him? Be attentive to hear the Spirit's cry in you pressing you to the Father today.

Wednesday: Rom. 8:14. What does it look like to be "led by the Spirit"? Since it is the Spirit who accomplishes this work, what role do we have (cf. Col. 3:5-10)? How does the Spirit's work in us enable us to work, too? (cf. Rom. 8:2) Rest in the assurance that comes from knowing that your salvation is from beginning to end, the work of God in Christ, through His Spirit in you.


Thursday: Rom. 8:16. It is the Spirit who testifies that we are children of God, so how does that give assurance to you? How is that different from resting in your own strength? Your performance? How can knowing the Spirit is the One who testifies that you belong to God produce perseverance in you?

Friday: Rom. 8:17. Why does Paul add a condition, provided we suffer with Him? How did Jesus, being God's eternal Son, obtain glorification (cf. Heb. 2:9,10)? How does Jesus call His disciples to live each day (Matt. 16:24)? How can knowing you are united to Christ in your suffering bring joy (1 Peter 4:12-19)? Entrust your soul entirely to your faithful Creator who is a good Father to you.

Saturday: How can we have hope in the midst of pain and suffering now? Read Rom. 8:18-25.
