Sermon Text — Romans 7:13-25

¹³ Did that which is good, then, bring death to me? By no means! It was sin, producing death in me through what is good, in order that sin might be shown to be sin, and through the commandment might become sinful beyond measure. ¹⁴ For we know that the law is spiritual, but I am of the flesh, sold under sin. ¹⁵ For I do not understand my own actions. For I do not do what I want, but I do the very thing I hate. ¹⁶ Now if I do what I do not want, I agree with the law, that it is good. ¹⁷ So now it is no longer I who do it, but sin that dwells within me. ¹⁸ For I know that nothing good dwells in me, that is, in my flesh. For I have the desire to do what is right, but not the ability to carry it out. ¹⁹ For I do not do the good I want, but the evil I do not want is what I keep on doing. ²⁰ Now if I do what I do not want, it is no longer I who do it, but sin that dwells within me.

²¹ So I find it to be a law that when I want to do right, evil lies close at hand. ²² For I delight in the law of God, in my inner being, ²³ but I see in my members another law waging war against the law of my mind and making me captive to the law of sin that dwells in my members. ²⁴ Wretched man that I am! Who will deliver me from this body of death? ²⁵ Thanks be to God through Jesus Christ our Lord! So then, I myself serve the law of God with my mind, but with my flesh I serve the law of sin.

DAILY DEVOTION

Memory Verse: Romans 6:22-23 — ²² But now that you have been set free from sin and have become slaves of God, the fruit you get leads to sanctification and its end, eternal life. ²³ For the wages of sin is death, but the free gift of God is eternal life in Christ Jesus our Lord.

Westminster Confession of Faith 6.5 — This corruption of nature, during this life, does remain in those that are regenerated; and although it be, through Christ, pardoned, and mortified; yet both itself, and all the motions thereof, are truly and properly sin.

Monday: Rom 7:14, 18 seem to refer to an unbeliever. How do the shift to present tense, v 22 (Rom 3:11, 18), and the existence of this battle to do right argue this is a believer's struggle to live for God? What does the believer delight in (v 22, 18)? Why (Ps 119:35, 1 John 5:3, John 15:10)? Pray about and focus your delight every day this week.

Tuesday: How many times to you see "sin dwells in" in Rom 7:13-25? Note the slavery references in v 14, 23. When a slave serves, in what sense are his actions really his, and in what sense are they not? When you sin, are you jumping in happily with no regret, or is there a reluctance, fighting, sorrow, and repentance? Take time to confess specific sins, and ask God to deepen your hatred of indwelling/remaining sin.

Wednesday: Rom 7:15-23. Think of a couple recent examples of when you desired to obey/please God, but ended up doing the opposite of what you wanted to do. How is this battle an evidence of faith? Why is the law (commandments, imperatives) unable to help be more faithful in this battle? Who do you really need to help (Rom 8:9-11)?

Thursday: Rom 7:24. What is Paul's response to this battle? Why is he so tormenting, groaning? How does Rom 8:22-24 help you understand Rom 7:24? Let this wretched-man-groaning deepen in you as you read 1 Cor 3:2 -3, Heb 5:11-14, Gal 5:22. What is this groaning meant to lead us to (the answer is not 'despair') (v 25, 8:15f)?

Friday: Read Rom 7:13-24 thoughtfully. Are you resonating with Paul as he bursts into v 25? What might Paul be looking back on as gives thanks for Christ's work (Rom 8:1-2)? What is he certainly looking forward to as the answer to this groaning (Rom 8:23, 1 Cor 15:57)? How does the certain and final vanquishment of sin give you hope and encouragement to press on for God's glory (25b)?

Saturday: Based on what you read in Rom 7:13-25, how is the Holy Spirit of Rom 8:1-8 essential in salvation, and in sanctification?

Invitation to the Lord's Supper

Since it is our privilege today to celebrate the blessed sacrament of the Lord's Supper, we are called to prepare our hearts by rightly examining ourselves.

"Do This in Remembrance of Me," says Jesus as He invites us to His Holy Supper. It is not only a privilege, but also a personal responsibility to respond to this gracious invitation. The apostle Paul alerts us to this responsibility in 1 Corinthians 11:27, "Therefore, whoever eats the bread or drinks the cup of the Lord in an unworthy manner will be guilty of sinning against the body and blood of the Lord." Furthermore, the Lord, through the Apostle Paul also instructs us that those who eat and drink "without recognizing the body of the Lord eats and drinks judgement on himself."

In light of the scriptural teaching, the elders invite you to join in the communion celebration on the basis of the following personal affirmations:

- 1. I confess that I am a sinner and repent of my sins.
- 2. I have been baptized into the name of the Father, the Son and the Holy Spirit.
- 3. I believe in Jesus as my Savior and Lord who forgives all my sins because of His sacrifice.
- 4. I desire to show my thankfulness to God by resolving to live in faith and obedience before my Lord, and in love and peace with my neighbors.
- 5. I have made a public profession of faith in a church that recognizes the sovereign authority of God's Word and that we are saved only by grace through faith in Jesus Christ.
- 6. I am a member in good standing in my home church.

If, for some reason, you do not believe you should partake of communion with God's people at this time, the elders would then urge you to refrain from participating today and they would also urge you to actively seek out either one of the elders or the pastor for further instruction. They are eager and willing to discuss these matters in light of God's Word, as they are called to tend to these matters for the purity of Christ's Church, His Glory, and the good of His people.

We are confident that the Savior accepts us at His table when we come in faith, with sorrow for our sins, and with a will to follow Him as He commands.
