

DAILY DEVOTION

Memory Verse: Romans 8:16-17— ¹⁶ **The Spirit himself bears witness with our spirit that we are children of God,** ¹⁷ and if children, then heirs—heirs of God and fellow heirs with Christ, provided we suffer with him in order that we may also be glorified with him.

Westminster Confession 21.3 Prayer, with thanksgiving, being one special part of religious worship, is by God required of all men: and, that it may be accepted, it is to be made in the name of the Son, by the help of His Spirit, according to His will, with understanding, reverence, humility, fervency, faith, love and perseverance; and, if vocal, in a known tongue.

Monday: Romans 8 assures us of our salvation and that God will sanctify us. Review the 5 main things the Spirit does in 8:5, 13, 15, 23, 26. How do these together strengthen your assurance that God loves you, give you confidence you can begin to please/live for God, and assure you that God will bring you to himself?

Tuesday: Rom 8:26. What kinds of weakness do you think Paul has in mind here (6:19, 7:23, 8:23)? "Helper" means "coming to the aid of, shouldering the burden." How is the Spirit a perfectly fit helper for these weaknesses? Do you feel weak? Pray that the Spirit helps you! (see also Paul's weakness in 2 Cor 12:9).

Wednesday: Rom 8:26. Have you ever been unsure of how to pray (e.g. 2 Cor 12:7, Phil 1:22-24)? How and why is this heightened in times of suffering (8:18) and trial? How does the fact that the Spirit prays for you when you don't know how comfort you? For what do you think the Spirit prays (8:26c, 18, 29b)? Murray: "Christ is their intercessor in the court of heaven [8:34, Heb 7:25]... while the Holy Spirit is their intercessor in the theatre of their own heart."

Thursday: Rom 8:27. How well does God know the Spirit's mind (way of thinking)? Where is the Spirit working this way of thinking (8:5-7)? According to what does the Spirit intercede (27)? How perfect then is the Spirit's intercession? How certainly are his prayers heard? Even if you are in physical, mental, spiritual chaos, how does this verse encourage you and give you hope? Are you praying God's Word?

Friday: Rom 8:26-27. How does the Spirit's help (Tuesday), the Spirit's intercession (Wednesday), and God's sure answer (Thursday) provide hope, encouragement, and assurance, especially in times of suffering and trial? Take courage, and rest in this.

Saturday: How does Rom 8:28-30 underline the certainty of salvation that God works?
