DAILY DEVOTION

Memory Verse: Romans 8:16-17— ¹⁶ The Spirit himself bears witness with our spirit that we are children of God, ¹⁷ and if children, then heirs—heirs of God and fellow heirs with Christ, provided we suffer with him in order that we may also be glorified with him.

Westminster Confession of Faith 3.5 Those of mankind that are predestinated unto life, God, before the foundation of the world was laid, according to His eternal and immutable purpose, and the secret counsel and good pleasure of His will, has chosen, in Christ, unto everlasting glory, out of His mere free grace and love, without any foresight of faith, or good works, or perseverance in either of them, or any other thing in the creature, as conditions, or causes moving Him thereunto; and all to the praise of His glorious grace.

Monday: How does it help to read Rom 8:28 in context (vv 18, 27)? Why might suffering or trial make you doubt all things are working for your good, that God loves you, or that you love God? How does knowing your Sovereign God has a wise, good and perfect plan ("will," "purpose") help? What hints do you get of that purpose in vv 29-30 (cf Gen 50:20)?

Tuesday: According to vv 29-30, what is God's purpose (28) for you? Who does all the acting in these verses? How does that assure you God's purpose will be completed (Phil 1:6)? As shaky as our faith and love often are (especially under sin, trial), how do vv 29-30 provide a "basement" or foundation that is much deeper and stronger than our own love for God?

Wednesday: Read the following verses to help define "foreknowledge": Rom 8:29, Deut 7:6-8, Eph 1:4-5, 1 Pet 1:20, Acts 4:28. Stott writes, "Foreknow can mean 'foresee who will believe' as the basis for predestination. But in this sense God foreknows everything and everyone, whereas Paul refers to a particular group. If God predestines because they are going to believe, the ground of their salvation is themselves and their merit, not God and his mercy. But Paul's whole emphasis is on God's free initiative of grace." Foreknow is to be known deeply beforehand, or to be "foreloved" (cf Hos 13:5, Amos 3:2). How does that deepen your security, and love for God?

Thursday: Rom 8:29. Predestination (decide upon beforehand, predetermine) is the direction or destination of foreknowledge (God setting his love on you in time past). According to v 29, what is the goal of predestination (Eph 1:4b-5)? How does suffering contribute to this (Rom 5:3-5)? Where do you need to grow in conforming to Christ (Col 3:10)?

Friday: Rom 8:29-30. If v 29 is the "before time" foundation of our faith, v 30 is the "when it is brought to actuation fruition in us" foundation. How is Christ's finished work (justified) part of our assurance? What is the sure end of God's plan? How does this answer Rom 8:18's question especially in light of suffering and groaning?

Saturday: How can Rom 8:28-30 be seen as an introduction to God's unstoppable love for us (which is described in vv 31-39?
