Sermon Text — Romans 8:31-39

³¹ What then shall we say to these things? If God is for us, who can be against us? ³² He who did not spare his own Son but gave him up for us all, how will he not also with him graciously give us all things? ³³ Who shall bring any charge against God's elect? It is God who justifies. ³⁴ Who is to condemn? Christ Jesus is the one who died—more than that, who was raised—who is at the right hand of God, who indeed is interceding for us. ³⁵ Who shall separate us from the love of Christ? Shall tribulation, or distress, or persecution, or famine, or nakedness, or danger, or sword? ³⁶ As it is written,

"For your sake we are being killed all the day long;

we are regarded as sheep to be slaughtered."

³⁷ No, in all these things we are more than conquerors through him who loved us. ³⁸ For I am sure that neither death nor life, nor angels nor rulers, nor things present nor things to come, nor powers, ³⁹ nor height nor depth, nor anything else in all creation, will be able to separate us from the love of God in Christ Jesus our Lord.

DAILY DEVOTION

Memory Verse: Romans $8:18 - ^{18}$ For I consider that the sufferings of this present time are not worth comparing with the glory that is to be revealed to us.

Westminster Confession of Faith 17.2. This perseverance of the saints depends not upon their own free will, but upon the immutability of the decree of election, flowing from the free and unchangeable love of God the Father; upon the efficacy of the merit and intercession of Jesus Christ, the abiding of the Spirit, and of the seed of God within them, and the nature of the covenant of grace: from all which arises also the certainty and infallibility thereof.

Monday: Look up Romans 8:29-30, 26, 1, 7:4, 5:1-2, 3:24-26 to see what "these things" in 8:31 means; the basis for God's inseparable love for his children. According to v 32 how do we know God is for us? Ponder the wonder of v 32 by reading it multiple times, emphasizing a different word each time.

Tuesday: Rom 8:33-34. What 4 groups can bring charges against us (e.g. Zech 3:1, 1 Pet 3:16, 4:4, Rom 1:18)? How does God respond to any such charge (33b, Rom 5:6ff)? What 4 grounds of Christ's work anchor God's love for us (v 32)? What does the fact that Christ is interceding for you right now say to you about the security of your salvation and the Father's love for you?

Wednesday: Rom 8:35-36. Troubles and trials can be seen as trying to separate us from God's love. Why is that not possible (vv 31-35, 8:14ff)? What was Paul's own experience (2 Cor 11:26f, Rom 5:3-5)? Is suffering anything new for the believer (v 36, Ps 44:22)? Praise God that nothing can separate you from his love in Christ.

Thursday: Rom 8:37. What is a conqueror? Does this verse mean we will conquer all sin? Will we escape all enemies and trouble? How does it tie in to 8:18, 30? Why does Paul add "through him who loved us" (Jn 16:33, 14:1f/1 Pet 5:9-10)? How does Rom 8:31-37 give you confidence and courage? Calvin writes that conquerors "always struggle and emerge."

Friday: Review Romans 8 to see why Paul is so certain nothing can separate us from God's love. Think about the power of the things mentioned in Rom 8:38-39. What are they compared to God's covenant commitment, Christ's finished work, and the Spirit's power?! All this is ours "in Christ Jesus" -through his perfect love. What love! "We are hedged around with mercy. We are enclosed in the arms of everlasting love" (Hodge). How does that change your view of self, elevate your view of God, hearten you for today?

Saturday: Pray for God's Word to be powerfully preached and received tomorrow.
