Confession of Sin — Daniel 9:3-19 (responsive)

³ Then I turned my face to the Lord God, seeking him by prayer and pleas for mercy with fasting and sackcloth and ashes. ⁴ I prayed to the Lord my God and made confession, saying, "O Lord, the great and awesome God, who keeps covenant and steadfast love with those who love him and keep his commandments, ⁵ we have sinned and done wrong and acted wickedly and rebelled, turning aside from your commandments and rules. ⁶ We have not listened to your servants the prophets, who spoke in your name to our kings, our princes, and our fathers, and to all the people of the land. ⁷ To you, O Lord, belongs righteousness, but to us open shame, as at this day, to the men of Judah, to the inhabitants of Jerusalem, and to all Israel, those who are near and those who are far away, in all the lands to which you have driven them, because of the treachery that they have committed against you. ⁸ To us, O Lord, belongs open shame, to our kings, to our princes, and to our fathers, because we have sinned against you. 9 To the Lord our God belong mercy and forgiveness, for we have rebelled against him ¹⁰ and have not obeved the voice of the Lord our God by walking in his laws, which he set before us by his servants the prophets. ¹⁷ All Israel has transgressed your law and turned aside, refusing to obey your voice. And the curse and oath that are written in the Law of Moses the servant of God have been poured out upon us, because we have sinned against him.¹² He has confirmed his words, which he spoke against us and against our rulers who ruled us, by bringing upon us a great calamity. For under the whole heaven there has not been done anything like what has been done against Jerusalem. ¹³ As it is written in the Law of Moses, all this calamity has come upon us; yet we have not entreated the favor of the Lord our God, turning from our iniquities and gaining insight by your truth.¹⁴ Therefore the Lord has kept ready the calamity and has brought it upon us, for the Lord our God is righteous in all the works that he has done, and we have not obeyed his voice. ¹⁵ And now. O Lord our God, who brought your people out of the land of Egypt with a mighty hand, and have made a name for yourself, as at this day, we have sinned, we have done wickedly.

¹⁶ "O Lord, according to all your righteous acts, let your anger and your wrath turn away from your city Jerusalem, your holy hill, because for our sins, and for the iniquities of our fathers, Jerusalem and your people have become a byword among all who are around us. ¹⁷ Now therefore, O our God, listen to the prayer of your servant and to his pleas for mercy, and for your own sake, O Lord, make your face to shine upon your sanctuary, which is desolate. ¹⁸ O my God, incline your ear and hear. Open your eyes and see our desolations, and the city that is called by your name. For we do not present our pleas before you because of our righteousness, but because of your great mercy. ¹⁹ O Lord, hear; O Lord, forgive. O Lord, pay attention and act. Delay not, for your own sake, O my God, because your city and your people are called by your name."



Sermon Text — Romans 8:18-25

¹⁸ For I consider that the sufferings of this present time are not worth comparing with the glory that is to be revealed to us. ¹⁹ For the creation waits with eager longing for the revealing of the sons of God. ²⁰ For the creation was subjected to futility, not willingly, but because of him who subjected it, in hope ²¹ that the creation itself will be set free from its bondage to corruption and obtain the freedom of the glory of the children of God. ²² For we know that the whole creation has been groaning together in the pains of childbirth until now. ²³ And not only the creation, but we ourselves, who have the firstfruits of the Spirit, groan inwardly as we wait eagerly for adoption as sons, the redemption of our bodies. ²⁴ For in this hope we were saved. Now hope that is seen is not hope. For who hopes for what he sees? ²⁵ But if we hope for what we do not see, we wait for it with patience.

Westminster Shorter Catechism 19 What is the misery of that estate whereinto man fell? All mankind by their fall lost communion with God, are under his wrath and curse, and so made liable to all miseries in this life, to death itself, and to the pains of hell for ever.

Monday: What is the expectation for this present time in Rom 8:18 (see 1 Pet 4:12ff, Mt 16:24)? How does it contrast to messages of "Come to Jesus and your suffering will stop." What does suffering (including sacrifice) for Christ look like for you? Grieve before the Lord the churches' sufferings.

Tuesday: Rom 8:18 says "the glory that is to be revealed to (lit. into) us." How does Rom 8:23 explain what that glory is (see 2 Cor 3:18, 4:16 -18)? How does this add purpose and hope to our suffering now (Rom 8:17, Acts 14:22, 2 Tim 2:12)?

Wednesday: Rom 8:19-22. In what ways in creation groaning/suffering futility? What caused creation's groaning (Gen 3:17-19)? Creation isn't yearning to be free from human rule, but for a different kind of human rule. Think about how creation will taste "the freedom of the glory of the children of God" when they are sinless, and raised to immortal life on the new earth.

Thursday: Rom 8:23. What comparison does Paul make between creation and Christians? The Spirit is the first-fruits (down payment) of this glorious future age. By his influence we groan in eager expectation for that future age. What does v 23 say we wait for (see 1 Cor 16:22, Rev 22:20, Mt 6:10)? How do creation's, the church's, and your sufferings make you long eagerly for Christ's return and our future life?

Friday: Rom 8:25 says literally "we eagerly wait for it with patience." How does suffering produce an eager longing? How does future glory produce a patience in suffering? How does suffering (even if it's minor) now reveal your heart's deepest longing, and cause you to already now find more satisfaction in Christ alone?

Saturday: Given the forward looking groaning or yearning of Rom 8:18-25, what do you think the Spirit is groaning for in Romans 8:26-27?
