

And the Lord appointed a great fish to swallow up Jonah. And Jonah was in the belly of the fish three days and three nights.

Then Jonah prayed to the Lord his God from the belly of the fish, ² saying, "I called out to the Lord, out of my distress, and he answered me; out of the belly of Sheol I cried, and you heard my voice.

and the flood surrounded me; all your waves and your billows passed over me.

DAILY DEVOTION

Memory Text: Romans $8:28 - ^{28}$ And we know that for those who love God all things work together for good, for those who are called according to his purpose.

Westminster Confession 7.3. Man, by his fall, having made himself incapable of life by that covenant, the Lord was pleased to make a second, commonly called the covenant of grace; wherein He freely offers unto sinners life and salvation by Jesus Christ; requiring of them faith in Him, that they may be saved, and promising to give unto all those that are ordained unto eternal life His Holy Spirit, to make them willing, and able to believe.

Monday: Jonah 1:17-2:1, 10. God's appointing the fish and commanding the fish provide book-ends for the poem. What is the significance of that? How does a robust view of God's sovereignty change your view of trials/miseries? "Men have been looking so hard at the great fish that they have failed to see the great God." How do you see God's greatness in this chapter?

Tuesday: Muse on Jonah 2:2-6, especially how Jonah describes his plight. Why does he say he was "driven away" by God (v 4)? What did it take for Jonah to care about God's sight/presence (1:3, 10, 2:4)? Think about how precisely God moves to discipline/disciple us. How do you view his difficult providences (Rev 3:19, James 1:3-4)?

Wednesday: Jonah 2:2-9. What did Jonah learn by experience in order to be a suitable minister of grace of the Ninevites? How does God's equipping Jonah give us confidence in God's purpose when we are sorely tried? The ultimate truth about God is that God is a saving God (2:9). Why is that more important than God being "Israel's God", or "Jonah's God", or "my God?" Give thanks for your salvation.

Thursday: Jonah 2. What "smaller sins" do you think led Jonah to this sin of rebelling against God? What lies did he believe about God (e.g. v 8)? How did death provoke him to rethink his life and bring repentance? What hope was there in looking to the holy temple (v 4, 7, 1 Ki 8:28-30)? Spend some time confessing specifics sins in light of the ultimate Temple in Rom 3:24-25.

Friday: Jonah 2. How does Jonah's prayer teach us to pray? Jonah was forced to slow down and think. We live in a face, hectic pace and leave little time for "stillness of soul, for solitude to examine who we really are and what we have of haven't done." In light of this, reflect on your last week. Where was God in your week?

Saturday: Read Jonah 3. Do the Ninevites hear any hope of mercy from God?
