DAILY DEVOTION

Memory Verse: Romans 8:19 — ¹⁸ For I consider that the sufferings of this present time are not worth comparing with the glory that is to be revealed to us. ¹⁹ For the creation waits with eager longing for the revealing of the sons of God.

Westminster Larger Catechism 116 What is required in the fourth commandment? The fourth commandment requires of all men the sanctifying or keeping holy to God such set times as he has appointed in his Word, expressly one whole day in seven; which was the seventh from the beginning of the world to the resurrection of Christ, and the first day of the week ever since, and so to continue to the end of the world; which is the Christian sabbath, and in the New Testament called the Lord's day.

Monday: Read Mark 2:23-28. To what do the Pharisees object (Deut 23:25, Ex 34:21)? Was this really forbidden? How does Jesus answer them (1 Sam 21:5)? In light of Lev 24:8-9, why do you think God never condemned David? Look at Mk 3:4 for part of the Sabbath's intent. How do you promote these things (especially on Sundays)?

Tuesday: Mk 2:27 says the Sabbath was "made" for man. When and why was the Sabbath established (Gen 2:2-3)? Who was it to reflect, and why (Gen 2:2, Ex 20:11, Heb 4:10)? Why did God have to mandate both work and rest? How can you take both more seriously? Are there any Sabbath ceremonial elements that fade away with Christ's coming (e.g. Ex 35:2, 3)?

Wednesday: Mk 2:23-28. How were the Pharisees living as if "man was made for the Sabbath"? Does the NT abolish the Sabbath/Lord's Day (Rev 1:10, Heb 10:24, 2 Tim 4:1-2)? What does "the Sabbath was made for man" reveal about God's intent for the Sabbath (Mk 3:4, Is 58:13)? What does it celebrate (Lk 4:18-21, Gen 2:2, Heb 4:3f)? How is it to provide sanity in a busy life? How can you do that better?

Thursday: Mk 2:28. How does the Lord of the Sabbath (who has authority over it) correct the Pharisees' abuse of it? Jesus claims this as the Lord's Day (now celebrating his finished work/rest, instead of anticipating it). How does the early church practice this day (Acts 20:7ff, 1 Cor 16:2, 11:17ff)? How can you better prepare for and prioritize the Lord's Day, and focus on the Lord of the Sabbath?

Friday: Through Christ we have entered Sabbath rest, and the Year of Jubilee has come. However, neither of these is yet complete. Where is the ultimate fulfillment of the Sabbath (Heb 4:8-10)? Ponder the fullness of eternal Sabbath in the following: its creation-celebration, redemption-celebration, soul and body rest, full delight and worship of God, fully being set apart to God.

Saturday: Read Jonah 1. What is the point of this story?
