²⁵ See that you do not refuse him who is speaking. Sermon Text — Jonah 3

Then the word of the Lord came to Jonah the second time, saying, ² "Arise, go to Nineveh, that great city, and call out against it the message that I tell you." ³ So Jonah arose and went to Nineveh, according to the word of the Lord. Now Nineveh was an exceedingly great city, three days' journey in breadth. ⁴ Jonah began to go into the city, going a day's journey. And he called out, "Yet forty days, and Nineveh shall be overthrown!" ⁵ And the people of Nineveh believed God. They called for a fast and put on sackcloth, from the greatest of them to the least of them.

⁶ The word reached the king of Nineveh, and he arose from his throne, removed his robe, covered himself with sackcloth, and sat in ashes. ⁷ And he issued a proclamation and published through Nineveh, "By the decree of the king and his nobles: Let neither man nor beast, herd nor flock, taste anything. Let them not feed or drink water, ⁸ but let man and beast be covered with sackcloth, and let them call out mightily to God. Let everyone turn from his evil way and from the violence that is in his hands. ⁹ Who knows? God may turn and relent and turn from his fierce anger, so that we may not perish."

¹⁰ When God saw what they did, how they turned from their evil way, God relented of the disaster that he had said he would do to them, and he did not do it.

DAILY DEVOTION

Memory Text: Romans $8:29 - ^{29}$ For those whom he foreknew he also predestined to be conformed to the image of his Son, in order that he might be the firstborn among many brothers.

Westminster Shorter Catechism 87. What is repentance unto life? Repentance unto life is a saving grace, whereby a sinner, out of a true sense of his sin, and apprehension of the mercy of God in Christ, doth, with grief and hatred of his sin, turn from it unto God, with full purpose of, and endeavor after, new obedience.

Monday: Compare Jonah 3:1-4 to 1:1-3. In light of 1:3, why is "a second time" surprising? What does this tell you about God? How does the text highlight the different response of Jonah this time? Why is his response not surprising in light of chapter 2? How is evangelism and sharing about God a fitting response to lavish mercy? What plans can you make to evangelize, and befriend your neighbors this summer?

Tuesday: Jonah 3:4. Why does God include a 40-day 'grace' period? Consider Jonah 3:4 in light of Jeremiah 18:7f (2 Pet 3:7-10). What place does the message of God's wrath against sin, judgment, hell play in your life and in American Christianity? What happens if this doctrine is neglected? If Jonah proclaimed more than just v 4 (likely), how might his personal story of God's salvation have painted gospel-hope for the Ninevites (1 Tim 1:16)?

Wednesday: Jonah 3:4-9. What message did the Ninevites respond to? How long did Jonah preach before they responded? How did the king hear it? How widespread was its effect? What does this tell you about the power of God (2 Cor 4:4-6? What does it tell you about the messenger (2 Cor 4:7)? How should this give us courage to witness?

Thursday: Jonah 3:4-9. Look at the shorter catechism above for a definition of repentance. Which of these elements to you see in the Ninevites? What else can you learn from them about repentance? Take some time to reflect on the place of repentance in your own life. Did they "apprehend God's mercy"? Are you (Eph 1:7, Micah 7:18-20)?

Friday: Jonah 3:10. In light of Jer 18:7f, God relents (analogical language to help us understand God, "is moved to pity") of his judgment. Why did the Israelites need to hear this message (Hos 7:10, Joel 2:12, Amos 5:14f)? What message does the Ninevite repentance communicate to them? How does Mt 12:41 verify this? What sins do you need to flee to Christ for?

Saturday: In light of Jonah 4, was Jonah's response in chapter 2 insincere?

Budget Year to Date

General Fund giving: \$195,776

• Expenses: \$216,653

Giving to building fund: \$9,534

- Building Fund: Although we do not have a current capital campaign, we do plan to build a bigger sanctuary and more classrooms in the not-too-distant future. Therefore, if you'd like to give to the building fund, please do so my designating "building fund" in the memo line on your checks.
- **Budget Change**: The Trustees wanted to inform you that we have reduced giving to our Presbytery's Home Missions Support to their original 2019 request of \$67.00. We had budgeted an elevated giving level of \$87.50 per communicant member in order to help presbytery afford a church planting pastor (regional home missionary). However, it has become clear that presbytery cannot support such a position for the near future, and are considering moving to a different church planting model (i.e. churches daughtering church plants). If you have any further questions about this, please direct them to pastor Francis.
