#### Sermon Text — Jonah 1:1-17

Now the word of the Lord came to Jonah the son of Amittai, saying, <sup>2</sup> "Arise, go to Nineveh, that great city, and call out against it, for their evil has come up before me." <sup>3</sup> But Jonah rose to flee to Tarshish from the presence of the Lord. He went down to Joppa and found a ship going to Tarshish. So he paid the fare and went down into it, to go with them to Tarshish, away from the presence of the Lord.

<sup>4</sup> But the Lord hurled a great wind upon the sea, and there was a mighty tempest on the sea, so that the ship threatened to break up. <sup>5</sup> Then the mariners were afraid, and each cried out to his god. And they hurled the cargo that was in the ship into the sea to lighten it for them. But Jonah had gone down into the inner part of the ship and had lain down and was fast asleep. <sup>6</sup> So the captain came and said to him, "What do you mean, you sleeper? Arise, call out to your god! Perhaps the god will give a thought to us, that we may not perish."

<sup>7</sup> And they said to one another, "Come, let us cast lots, that we may know on whose account this evil has come upon us." So they cast lots, and the lot fell on Jonah. <sup>8</sup> Then they said to him, "Tell us on whose account this evil has come upon us. What is your occupation? And where do you come from? What is your country? And of what people are you?" <sup>9</sup> And he said to them, "I am a Hebrew, and I fear the Lord, the God of heaven, who made the sea and the dry land." <sup>10</sup> Then the men were exceedingly afraid and said to him, "What is this that you have done!" For the men knew that he was fleeing from the presence of the Lord, because he had told them.

<sup>11</sup> Then they said to him, "What shall we do to you, that the sea may quiet down for us?" For the sea grew more and more tempestuous. <sup>12</sup> He said to them, "Pick me up and hurl me into the sea; then the sea will quiet down for you, for I know it is because of me that this great tempest has come upon you." <sup>13</sup> Nevertheless, the men rowed hard to get back to dry land, but they could not, for the sea grew more and more tempestuous against them. <sup>14</sup>Therefore they called out to the Lord, "O Lord, let us not perish for this man's life, and lay not on us innocent blood, for you, O Lord, have done as it pleased you." <sup>15</sup> So they picked up Jonah and hurled him into the sea, and the sea ceased from its raging. <sup>16</sup> Then the men feared the Lord exceedingly, and they offered a sacrifice to the Lord and made vows. <sup>17</sup> And the Lord appointed a great fish to swallow up Jonah. And Jonah was in the belly of the fish three days and three nights.



#### DAILY DEVOTION

**Memory Text** — **1 Samuel 15:22** And Samuel said, "Has the Lord as great delight in burnt offerings and sacrifices, as in obeying the voice of the Lord? Behold, to obey is better than sacrifice, and to listen than the fat of rams.'"

**Westminster Shorter Catechism—** Q. 42. What is the sum of the ten commandments? A. The sum of the ten commandments is, To love the Lord our God with all our heart, with all our soul, with all our strength, and with all our mind; and our neighbour as ourselves.

**Monday:** Jonah 1:1,2. What aspects of God's character are communicated by these two straightforward verses? How does He view creation and mankind in our day? What does this say about how the LORD is active in our world today?

**Tuesday**: Jonah 1:3. The Scriptures teach us that at the time of Jonah the Holy Spirit did not yet dwell within His people, yet Jonah had the Spirit come upon him as a prophet of the LORD. How much sense did it make for Jonah "to flee to Tarshish, away from the presence of the LORD" (v.3)? It can seem so obvious from our vantage point, but how about the times we "run away" from the LORD? Ponder today what it would be like if you could run away from the LORD. Give thanks He has promised to never leave or forsake His children.

**Wednesday:** Jonah 1:4. How does the text portray the source of the calamity to befall Jonah and the ship? How should we interpret "natural disasters" today? Does the LORD change (cf. Heb 13:8)? How does this chapter portray the purpose the LORD intends for this calamity to come upon Jonah? What does that say about His commitment to Jonah? To you?

**Thursday:** Jonah 1:5. What is so amazing in v 5? (Cf. Luke 8:24) the calming of the waves by Jesus. How can we have this type of peace *in a real way* in spite of raging storms? How can our disobedience anesthetize us from the storms other people experience, i.e...Jonah's response?

**Friday:** Jonah 1:7-14. It is interesting to note how God uses Jonah's disobedience for good in the lives of these sailors. They not only sacrifice but vow to do more when opportunity avails itself. If this is the result of Jonah's disobedience, think how his obedience would have been used. How much trust do we put in reading and hearing God's word without the bells and whistles?

**Saturday:** Read over Jonah chapter 2 in your devotions today, make his prayer your own. Exalt the LORD Who alone is your salvation.
