Sermon Text — Jonah 4

But it displeased Jonah exceedingly, and he was angry. ² And he prayed to the Lord and said, “O Lord, is not this what I said when I was yet in my country? That is why I made haste to flee to Tarshish; for I knew that you are a gracious God and merciful, slow to anger and abounding in steadfast love, and relenting from disaster. ³ Therefore now, O Lord, please take my life from me, for it is better for me to die than to live.” ⁴ And the Lord said, “Do you do well to be angry?” ⁵ Jonah went out of the city and sat to the east of the city and made a booth for himself there. He sat under it in the shade, till he should see what would become of the city. ⁶ Now the Lord God appointed a plant and made it come up over Jonah, that it might be a shade over his head, to save him from his discomfort. So Jonah was exceedingly glad because of the plant. ⁷ But when dawn came up the next day, ⁸ God appointed a worm that attacked the plant, so that it withered. ⁸ When the sun rose, God appointed a scorching east wind, and the sun beat down on the head of Jonah so that he was faint. And he asked that he might die and said, “It is better for me to die than to live.” ⁹ But God said to Jonah, “Do you do well to be angry for the plant?” And he said, “Yes, I do well to be angry, angry enough to die.” ¹⁰ And the Lord said, “You pity the plant, for which you did not labor, nor did you make it grow, which came into being in a night and perished in a night. ¹¹ And should not I pity Nineveh, that great city, in which there are more than 120,000 persons who do not know their right hand from their left, and also much cattle?”

DAILY DEVOTION

Memory Text: 1 Samuel 15:22 — 'And Samuel said, "Has the Lord as great delight in burnt offerings and sacrifices, as in obeying the voice of the Lord? Behold, to obey is better than sacrifice, and to listen than the fat of rams.' "

Westminster Shorter Catechism — Q. 42. *What is the sum of the ten commandments?* A. The sum of the ten commandments is, To love the Lord our God with all our heart, with all our soul, with all our strength, and with all our mind; and our neighbor as ourselves.

Monday: Jonah 4:1. What makes Jonah get so angry? Is it that the LORD showed mercy to Nineveh, or that his prophetic words did not come true (Jonah 3:4)? How do we get twisted around when the things we speak or plan do not come to pass- when the intentions of our heart are subjected to the purposes of the LORD's (see Prov. 16:9; 19:21)

Tuesday: Jonah 4:2. Now we are told why Jonah fled from the presence of the LORD (Jonah 1:3). What does it say about our view of the mercy of God in Christ when we are unwilling to extend mercy to others? Is our view of Christ too low? or is our view of ourselves just way too high?

Wednesday: Jonah 4:3–4; 8–9. How does the text portray Jonah's response to the LORD's calling in his life? To the Lord's chastisements? Are we also so willing to disobey that we flee from His Spirit? How did that work out for Jonah? How does that work out for you and I?

Thursday: Jonah 4: 5–10. Why was it so hard for him to accept that the LORD would show mercy to Nineveh (see Nahum 3:1–4)? How willing was Jonah to be inconvenienced for Nineveh? How well do we as a church reach out to others? How about if it is inconvenient? What does that say about how we value the image of God in other people?

Friday: Jonah 4:11. Notice how the ending, such as it is, is consistent with the beginning of this book (Jonah 1:1). Why does the book end this way? What does the LORD call His people to do as a result of the answer to the last question? How should this inform our evangelism?

Saturday: Ponder the mercy you have received and continue to receive through the person and work of Jesus Christ. How can you best honor the LORD and His call for you in the life you have been given?
