Sermon Text — Romans 10:4-13

⁴ For Christ is the end of the law for righteousness to everyone who believes. ⁵ For Moses writes about the righteousness that is based on the law, that the person who does the commandments shall live by them. ⁶ But the righteousness based on faith says, "Do not say in your heart, 'Who will ascend into heaven?'" (that is, to bring Christ down) ⁷ "or 'Who will descend into the abyss?'" (that is, to bring Christ up from the dead). ⁸ But what does it say? "The word is near you, in your mouth and in your heart" (that is, the word of faith that we proclaim); ⁹ because, if you confess with your mouth that Jesus is Lord and believe in your heart that God raised him from the dead, you will be saved. ¹⁰ For with the heart one believes and is justified, and with the mouth one confesses and is saved. ¹¹ For the Scripture says, "Everyone who believes in him will not be put to shame." ¹² For there is no distinction between Jew and Greek; for the same Lord is Lord of all, bestowing his riches on all who call on him. ¹³ For "everyone who calls on the name of the Lord will be saved."

DAILY DEVOTION

Memory Text: **Romans 10:17** — ¹⁷ So faith comes from hearing, and hearing through the word of Christ.

Heidelberg Catechism What is true faith True faith is not only a certain knowledge, whereby I hold for truth all that God has revealed to us in his word, but also an assured confidence, which the Holy Spirit works by the gospel in my heart; that not only to others, but to me also, remission of sin, everlasting righteousness and salvation, are freely given by God, merely of grace, only for the sake of Christ's merits.

Monday: According to Rom 10:5 what does the law as a covenant of works teach (Gal 3:12, Lev 18:5, Gen 2:17)? Why could obedience/law keeping never bring the righteousness it promised (Rom 3:10-19, Deut 31:21, 9:6)? How does "obedience for blessing" infect your thinking, expectations, evaluation of others, and actions?

Tuesday: Read Rom 10:5-7. How does the definition of faith (above) blow up righteousness based on law? How does Paul use Deut 30:12-13 to back this point? His point is that the Word is near us and accessible. How did Christ make this especially true (Jn 3:13, Gal 4:4)? Wonder at the free gift of grace based on Jesus' merits.

Wednesday: Rom 10:8-10. To be saved one must believe certain truths. How does Paul summarize them in v 9? What else included in that (1 Cor 15:3-5, 1 Tim 1:15)? Why does Paul add "believe 'in your heart'"? Do you have an inward persuasion that Jesus died for your sins and adopted you into his family? Praise him for his glorious work. How should appreciation of the Lord lead to application in your life?

Thursday: Rom 10:8-10. Why does Paul add "confess with your mouth" to believing (James 2:17-20). What does "confessing with your mouth" say about the importance of a profession of faith in front of the church? What does it say about the visibility of your faith? About witnessing? About worship? Muse on this: we will confess the glory of Christ for all eternity with all the saints!

Friday: How does Rom 10:11-13 answer the last part of 10:4? Do you call on the name of the Lord? Do you love Him? How is Jesus' lordship (your Master) reflected in how you live? Note what kind of Master Jesus is -he bestows his riches on all who call on him. What are some of those riches (Rom 2:4, 9:23, Eph 1:7, 2:7)?

Saturday: Rom 10:14-21. Everyone who believes can be saved. But how are they to hear this message?
