²² But be doers of the word, and not hearers only, deceiving yourselves. ²³ For if anyone is a hearer of the word and not a doer, he is like a man who looks intently at his natural face in a mirror. ²⁴ For he looks at himself and goes away and at once forgets what he was like. ²⁵ But the one who looks into the perfect law, the law of liberty, and perseveres, being no hearer who forgets but a doer who acts, he will be blessed in his doing.

³⁰What shall we say, then? That Gentiles who did not pursue righteousness have attained it, that is, a righteousness that is by faith; ³¹ but that Israel who pursued a law that would lead to righteousness did not succeed in reaching that law. ³²Why? Because they did not pursue it by faith, but as if it were based on works. They have stumbled over the stumbling stone, ³³ as it is written,

"Behold, I am laying in Zion a stone of stumbling, and a rock of offense; and whoever believes in him will not be put to shame."

¹Brothers, my heart's desire and prayer to God for them is that they may be saved. ²For I bear them witness that they have a zeal for God, but not according to knowledge. ³For, being ignorant of the righteousness of God, and seeking to establish their own, they did not submit to God's righteousness. ⁴For Christ is the end of the law for righteousness to everyone who believes.

DAILY DEVOTION

Memory Text: Romans 10:15 — ¹⁵ And how are they to preach unless they are sent? As it is written, "How beautiful are the feet of those who preach the good news!"

Westminster Confession 19.6 Although true believers be not under the law, as a covenant of works, to be thereby justified, or condemned; yet is it of great use to them, as well as to others; in that, as a rule of life informing them of the will of God, and their duty, it directs and binds them to walk accordingly; discovering also the sinful pollutions of their nature, hearts and lives; so as, examining themselves thereby, they may come to further conviction of, humiliation for, and hatred against sin, together with a clearer sight of the need they have of Christ, and the perfection of His obedience.

Monday: In Romans 9 Paul looked at salvation from the perspective of God's sovereignty. In 9:30-10 he looks at it from man's responsibility. What are the surprising contrasts between the two responses in vv 30-31? How does the Gentile response tie in to Rom 1:16-17, 3:21-22? How does the gospel as the sole ground of salvation bring peace, rest, and joy to you?

Tuesday: Rom 9:32-33. What was Israel depending on that could not bring them right standing before God? How does Is 28:16 show Christ as the only secure place for standing? How does Is 8:14 show the deadly outcome of trusting anything but Christ for salvation? What do you tend to hold up to 'make God love you'? How often do you admire and exalt your own right-eous motives, actions, words? Bring this to God.

Wednesday: Compare Rom 10:1 with 9:1-5. Why does the doctrine of election (9:11, 15, 8:28-30) move Paul to pray for his lost kinsmen? Analyze your zeal/love for the lost. How can you grow in prayer, and especially in praying for certain lost people/nations?

Thursday: Rom 10:2-3. Use "zeal without knowledge" to critique the American church, Americans as a whole, and yourself. Why must you have both? How did the Israelites have zeal (Acts 21:20, 22:3, Gal 1:14) but not knowledge ("the righteousness that comes from God, v 3, 1:17)? How does seeking to establish your own righteousness nullify the cross and puff up self (Gal 2:21)?

Friday: Ash asks, "What is the difference between trying to establish our own righteousness and submitting to God's righteousness (Rom 10:2-4)? Who is God's righteousness, and how does the connection with 9:32, 33 help us understand this?" How does Christ's free righteousness kill your love of self-righteousness, and your trying to be "good enough" or better than others?

Saturday: If Rom 9:30-10:4 is why Israel failed to obtain salvation, how does Rom 10:4-13 describe how Gentiles did attain it?
