





DAILY DEVOTION

Memory Text **Rom 12:1-2** ¹I appeal to you therefore, brothers, by the mercies of God, to present your bodies as a living sacrifice, holy and acceptable to God, which is your spiritual worship. ²Do not be conformed to this world, but be transformed by the renewal of your mind, that by testing you may discern what is the will of God, what is good and acceptable and perfect.

Heidelberg Catechism 43. What further benefit do we receive from the sacrifice and death of Christ on the cross? *That by virtue thereof, our old man is crucified, dead and buried with him; that so the corrupt inclinations of the flesh may no more reign in us; but that we may offer ourselves unto him a sacrifice of thanksgiving.*

Monday: Romans 12:1. Paul appeals to us to live for Christ on the basis of God's "mercies." What plural mercies is it referring to (e.g. Rom 11:30-32, 5:1-6, Ps 51:3)? What is the natural and necessary response to God's mercy? Ponder God's mercies to you, and ask him to move your heart to respond in a specific obedience.

Tuesday: Rom 12:1-2. We have been delivered from sin's penalty (ch 1-11), but also its power (12-16). How does union with Christ continue to give us power to fight sin (Rom 6:2-6, 11, 13, Eph 4:20-24)? How does the Spirit help us fight (Rom 8:4, 9, 16)? In whose strength do you try to change? What is the place of prayer in sanctification? What must you call to mind as you seek to live obediently?

Wednesday: "Sacrifice." What was God really after in the OT sacrifice (Ps 51:16-17, Heb 9:13-14)? How do you see that in Rom 12:1? What is a "living" sacrifice (Rom 6:12-13)? OT sacrifices were to be unblemished (holy, set apart), acceptable to God, and a pleasing aroma (Lev 1:3, 9). How would viewing your obedience in those terms change what you do, say, think, wear, watch, listen to?

Thursday: What does Romans 1:25, 28 have to say about unbelievers' worship and minds? What are some priorities, ways of thinking and living that the world has bought into? Where has that crept into the church, and into your thinking? Consider Eph 4:17-19, Col 3:5-11. How incoherent sin is in light of God's mercy and glory! Lord help us.


Friday: Rom 12:2. Why must transformation (obedience) be tied to renewing our minds (thinking new ways)? Pick one or two areas of life (e.g. finances, conflict, disappointment, relationship, work) and consider how the following truths change your practice in those areas: gospel (Rom 3:23f), grace (Rom 5:1, 15), age to come (12:2, 1 Pet 1:13), union with Christ (6:1-7), Holy Spirit (Rom 5:5, 8:9, 14ff). What does a transformed mind really want to do?
