⁵ This is why I left you in Crete, so that you might put what remained into order, and appoint elders in every town as I directed you— ⁶ if anyone is above reproach, the husband of one wife, and his children are believers and not open to the charge of debauchery or insubordination. ⁷ For an overseer, as God's steward, must be above reproach. He must not be arrogant or quick-tempered or a drunkard or violent or greedy for gain, ⁸ but hospitable, a lover of good, self-controlled, upright, holy, and disciplined. ⁹ He must hold firm to the trustworthy word as taught, so that he may be able to give instruction in sound doctrine and also to rebuke those who contradict it.

DAILY DEVOTION

Memory Text: Titus 2:14 — "who gave Himself for us to redeem us from all law-lessness and to purify for Himself a people for His own possession who are zeal-ous for good works."

Westminster Shorter Catechism — *Q.* 90. How is the word to be read and heard, that it may become effectual to salvation? A. That the word may become effectual to salvation, we must attend thereunto with diligence, preparation, and prayer; receive it with faith and love, lay it up in our hearts, and practice it in our lives.

Monday: Titus 1:5. Why is Paul telling Titus why he left him in Crete? Didn't Titus know? Is it reasonable to think Paul left him without telling him? This highlights our need to read the word with all diligence, preparation, and prayer. To read thoughtfully, asking questions of the text. This is why the LORD has us read His Word together, as well as on our own. Pray for the LORD to open your ears and your heart to His word more fully today.

Tuesday: Titus 1:5. What is God's answer for the problems in His Church? How important is Stewardship in God's household to God (Acts 20:28–38; 1 Tim. 3:1–7; 1 Pet. 5:1–4)? How does this display God's Sovereign care for His people? How can that display His fatherly care for you? Give thanks today that Jesus is the Head of His Church and He does provide His care for you.

Wednesday: Titus 1:6–8. How does Paul sum up the qualifications of an elder? What does his repetition of this in verse 7 say about how important being above reproach is to be trusted with God's people? How does Paul start the list of qualifications? What does that say about the importance God places on our families to reflect our commitment to Him (Eph. 5:25–33)? This should drive us to Christ and His work in us and our families. Please pray for the elders and their families to honor Christ and reflect His glory.

Thursday: Titus 1:6–8. How can the elder hope to measure up to these commands (2:11–14)? What is God's purpose for these qualities to be evident in the life of the elder (2:7)? How does this reflect God's work in His people (3:3–5)? How does that challenge you? How does that tie in to God's call for your sanctification (2:2,6,9; 3:1–2)? Give thanks in all humility recognizing that our only hope is in our Great God and Savior Jesus Christ and His work in each one of us.

Friday: Titus 1:9. Why is this such an important aspect of the elder's work? Why is it His Word alone to be taught and preached (1:1–3)? What does God promise when His Word is preached faithfully (Rom. 10:14–15)? Rejoice and receive Christ as He comes to you and speaks His Word to you in the preaching of His Word weekly.

Saturday: Ponder these seemingly mundane stipulations and commands in this passage, how they point to our Father's faithful and loving care for His people, how Jesus exercises His rule and reign in His Church, and the Spirit's working in and through you to bring glory to Christ and blessing to you. Pray for our Pastor and for your elders to faithfully serve our Lord and His people in all things.
