DAILY DEVOTION

Memory Text — Romans 11:34 ³³ Oh, the depth of the riches and wisdom and knowledge of God! How unsearchable are his judgments and how inscrutable his ways! ³⁴ **“For who has known the mind of the Lord, or who has been his counselor?”**

Westminster Confession of Faith 2.2 — God has all life, glory, goodness, blessedness, in and of Himself; and is alone in and unto Himself all-sufficient, not standing in need of any creatures which He has made, nor deriving any glory from them, but only manifesting His own glory in, by, unto, and upon them. He is the alone fountain of all being, of whom, through whom, and to whom are all things; and has most sovereign dominion over them, to do by them, for them, or upon them whatsoever Himself pleases.

Monday: Theology leads to doxology. Rom 11:33, 36. What things has Paul just emphasized are “from” God (11:32, 25, 10:9, 4, 9:30, 11)? What does “all things from him” include? How and where does this truth need to change you (Eph 2:9, 1 Cor 4:7)? How does this truth lead you to exalt God? Spend some time doing that.

Tuesday: Rom 11:33, 35, 36. What significant gifts demonstrate the depths of God’s rich wisdom to us (Rom 1:16f, 3:24f, 5:1, 5, 6:13, 8:1, 15f, 18, 27, 39)? How are these things received “through” God (see Eph 3:8, 1:3-8)? Pray that God would use us to bring more to salvation. Pray for a deeper appreciation of his mercy and love, and for a loving-obedient life that flows more fully from it.

Wednesday: Rom 11:36. What does it mean that “all things” are “to Him”? What is the end reason/goal for everything (1 Cor 10:31, Is 43:19-21)? Think about your motivations for a minute. How does thinking about God’s glory as the ultimate purpose free you from attitudes and ambitions? How does it motivate you to more patience and grace? Consider how Paul paints God’s glory shaping us in 12:3ff.

Thursday: Rom 11:35, Job 35:7, 41:11. Is there anyone who can “obligate” God to give something to us? Where do you see that attitude in yourself? How does this verse underscore that salvation is completely from, through, and to the Lord? Consider the gift given us that we can never repay (3:24, 4:3-5, 5:15-17, 6:23)? Praise God for this, perhaps by singing to him.

Friday: Rom 11:36. “What overwhelms Paul in vv 33-36 is the unfathomable scheme of salvation, the riches of grace and mercy.” Ponder this short verse and its implications and pray God moves you to be overwhelmed with His rich grace. Ponder Isaiah 40:9-15 (v 13 is quoted in Rom 11:34) and 1 Cor 1:24. Pray that each Sunday we would glorify God, and see his infinite worth afresh.

Saturday: How is Romans 12:1-3 the only appropriate response to Rom 1-11?
