October 27, 2019

**Reflection** "I labored diligently and anxiously as to how to understand Paul's word...the expression `the righteousness of God` blocked the way, because I took it to mean that righteousness whereby God is righteous and deals righteously in punishing the unrighteousness. Although an impeccable monk, I stood before God as a sinner...therefore I did not love a righteous and angry God, but rather hated and murmured against him..." ~ Martin Luther

"Then I grasped that the righteousness of God is that righteousness by which through grace and sheer mercy God justifies us by faith. Thereupon I felt myself to be reborn and to have gone through open doors into paradise..." ~ Martin Luther

Martin Luther opened the Reformation by nailing "The Ninety-Five Theses" to the door of Wittenberg Cathedral. The very first of the theses was: "Our Lord and Master Jesus Christ...willed the entire life of believers to be one of repentance." On the surface this looks a little bleak! Luther seems to be saying Christians will never be making much progress. But of course that wasn't Luther's point at all. He was saying that repentance is the way we make progress in the Christian life. Indeed, pervasive, all-of-life-repentance is the best sign that we are growing deeply and rapidly into the character of Jesus.

# Sermon Text — Romans 14:1-12

<sup>1</sup>As for the one who is weak in faith, welcome him, but not to quarrel over opinions. <sup>2</sup> One person believes he may eat anything, while the weak person eats only vegetables. <sup>3</sup> Let not the one who eats despise the one who abstains, and let not the one who abstains pass judgment on the one who eats, for God has welcomed him. <sup>4</sup> Who are you to pass judgment on the servant of another? # **DAILY DEVOTION**

**Memory Text: Romans 13:10** —  $^{10}$  Love does no wrong to a neighbor; therefore love is the fulfilling of the law.

**Westminster Confession 33.1** God has appointed a day, wherein He will judge the world, in righteousness, by Jesus Christ, to whom all power and judgment is given of the Father. In which day, not only the apostate angels shall be judged, but likewise all persons that have lived upon earth shall appear before the tribunal of Christ, to give an account of their thoughts, words, and deeds; and to receive according to what they have done in the body, whether good or evil.

**Monday:** Look carefully at Rom 14:1-12, 21 to see what issues were dividing "the weak" and "the strong," and what tensions it caused (e.g. v 3). Imagine how the two sides might interact and its results in the church. Can you think of any modern parallels? Where do you tend to despise or pass judgment on others? Confess this to the Lord.

**Tuesday**: What command about the weak does Paul give the strong (Rom 14:1)? How is this more than simply a surface welcome (Acts 28:2, Philemon 17, Rom 15:7)? Contrast this to your attitude to other Christians (at New Hope and beyond) who disagree with you. Where is God calling you to welcome others? Pray for a heart attitude of welcome.

**Wednesday:** How does Paul rebuke both the strong and the weak in v 3? What reason for welcoming the weak does he give there? Think back over Romans -how has God welcomed you (Rom 8:33, 34, Eph 2:12-13)? Meditate on Rom 15:17 and pray God uses it to move you to praise Him through it, and to outward love (13:8).

**Thursday:** Rom 14:4-9. How many times does Paul use "Lord" here? Why (9)? How does his analogy of the slave-master relationship help his argument not to judge, but to welcome those who differ (in matters of conscience)? How consciously do you "live for the Lord"? Are the issues you stand strongly on really rooted in "living to the Lord"?

**Friday:** In Rom 14:10-12 Paul is writing to believers, who have been justified and saved from God's wrath (5:9, 10). When we judge, whose seat are we taking? Who is each Christian really accountable to? How does the fact that we will have to present ourselves before God, and render account of our thoughts, words, actions, change whose behavior we primarily worry about? Does this mean we shouldn't confront others about sin (Mt 7:1-5)? Pray for humility and wisdom.

**Saturday:** Read Romans 14:13-23. To what sacrificial responsibility is the stronger believer called? Why?
