

¹We who are strong have an obligation to bear with the failings of the weak, and not to please ourselves. ²Let each of us please his neighbor for his good, to build him up. ³For Christ did not please himself, but as it is written, "The reproaches of those who reproached you fell on me." ⁴For whatever was written in former days was written for our instruction, that through endurance and through the encouragement of the Scriptures we might have hope. ⁵May the God of endurance and encouragement grant you to live in such harmony with one another, in accord with Christ Jesus, ⁶that together you may with one voice glorify the God and Father of our Lord Jesus Christ. ⁷Therefore welcome one another as Christ has welcomed you, for the glory of God.



DAILY DEVOTION

Memory Text: Romans 14:17 ¹⁸ In hope he believed against hope, that he should become the father of many nations, as he had been told, "So shall your offspring be."

Westminster Shorter Catechism 42: The sum of the Ten Commandments is, "to love the Lord our God" with all our heart, all our soul, with all our strength, and with all our mind; and our neighbor as ourselves.

Monday: What do these words in Rom 15:1 draw on: obligation (13:7, 8), neighbor (13:9), build up (14:19)? How do they root the commands in love? What actions is God calling you to grow in, and what disposition must you have according to this verse? Where do you tend to please yourself (especially at church)? Pray to see this and change it.

Tuesday: How is Rom 15:3 one of the greatest understatements you have ever read? Look up Ps 69:8-9 (quoted in Rom 15:3), and Phil 2:3-9. Was Jesus motivated at all by self-pleasing? For what was he zealous? To what extent did he love the Father? How does his example (and extent of self-sacrificing service for you) help you more happily and willingly love, serve, and sacrifice for 'the weak' (those who differ with you?

Wednesday: Rom 15:4-6. What effect ought Scripture to have on the believer (v 4)? Do you read it for these things? Who is the source of these things (v 5)? What does the resulting hope in v 4 refer to (Rom 4:18, 8:23-25)? Do you see how this hope for Jew and Gentile drives unity and harmony? How should v 6 motivate you to pursuing harmony?

Thursday: What command and what reason for it are we given in Rom 15:7? How does this reflect in real life Jesus' unifying work? Are you welcoming/accepting toward those different or who differ from you? Vv 8-13 say the Roman Jews and Gentiles must welcome one another because Jesus united both to God. How did Jesus become a servant to the Jews, thus fulfilling the promises to the patriarchs (Gen 12:1-3, Mt 15:24, Rom 3:3, 4, 6, 21-22)?

Friday: What two things are repeated in almost every quote in Rom 15:9 -12? How did Jesus show his mercy to the Gentiles (Eph 2:12-14)? What is the end result of his mercy to them (9)? What is the final result of both Jews and Gentiles for all eternity (Rev 5:9-10, 7:9-10, Rev 21:1-4)? How will a robust focus on that, and prayer for the Holy Spirit, produce unity and harmony, and what v 13 says?

Saturday: Read Romans 15:14-21. Pray that God will work powerfully in the gospel ministry tomorrow, especially in light of Invitation Sunday.
