Sermon Text — Acts 2:22-41

²² "Men of Israel, hear these words: Jesus of Nazareth, a man attested to you by God with mighty works and wonders and signs that God did through him in your midst, as you yourselves know— ²³ this Jesus, delivered up according to the definite plan and foreknowledge of God, you crucified and killed by the hands of lawless men. ²⁴ God raised him up, loosing the pangs of death, because it was not possible for him to be held by it. ²⁵ For David says concerning him,

"'I saw the Lord always before me,

for he is at my right hand that I may not be shaken;

²⁶ therefore my heart was glad, and my tongue rejoiced;

my flesh also will dwell in hope.

²⁷ For you will not abandon my soul to Hades, or let your Holy One see corruption.

²⁸ You have made known to me the paths of life;

you will make me full of gladness with your presence.'

²⁹ "Brothers, I may say to you with confidence about the patriarch David that he both died and was buried, and his tomb is with us to this day. ³⁰Being therefore a prophet, and knowing that God had sworn with an oath to him that he would set one of his descendants on his throne, ³¹ he foresaw and spoke about the resurrection of the Christ, that he was not abandoned to Hades, nor did his flesh see corruption. ³² This Jesus God raised up, and of that we all are witnesses. ³³ Being therefore exalted at the right hand of God, and having received from the Father the promise of the Holy Spirit, he has poured out this that you yourselves are seeing and hearing. ³⁴ For David did not ascend into the heavens, but he himself says,

"'The Lord said to my Lord,

"Sit at my right hand,

³⁵ until I make your enemies your footstool."

³⁶ Let all the house of Israel therefore know for certain that God has made him both Lord and Christ, this Jesus whom you crucified."

³⁷ Now when they heard this they were cut to the heart, and said to Peter and the rest of the apostles, "Brothers, what shall we do?" ³⁸ And Peter said to them, "Repent and be baptized every one of you in the name of Jesus Christ for the forgiveness of your sins, and you will receive the gift of the Holy Spirit. ³⁹ For the promise is for you and for your children and for all who are far off, everyone whom the Lord our God calls to himself."

⁴⁰ And with many other words he bore witness and continued to exhort them, saying, "Save yourselves from this crooked generation." ⁴¹ So those who received his word were baptized, and there were added that day about three thousand souls.

DAILY DEVOTION

Memory Text — For the promise is for you and for your children and for all who are far off, everyone whom the Lord our God calls to himself, Acts 2:39, ESV.

Westminster Shorter Catechism— Q. 88. What are the outward means whereby Christ communicates to us the benefits of redemption? A. The outward and ordinary means whereby Christ communicates to us the benefits of redemption, are his ordinances, especially the word, sacraments, and prayer; all which are made effectual to the elect for salvation.

Monday: Read Acts 2:22–24. How do these verses display the doctrine of the Sovereignty of God *and* the responsibility and accountability of man's free will? How does (do) the Scripture (s) present these two at various times? How does this inform our understanding of God's Covenant with man?

Tuesday: Read Acts 2:25–28. How did Jesus' knowledge of these verses likely impact Him in His earthly ministry? (cf. Matt. 4:4; John 17:1–5). How does Christ's reliance upon the Scriptures give our lives direction? Confidence?

Wednesday: Read Acts 2:22-28. Why did Jesus have to be truly man (22)? What was the point of Jesus' miracles (v 22)? What does v 23 tell you about God's sovereignty? Why could death not hold Jesus (v 23, Rom 6:23, v 27 and Ps 16)? How does that impact you?

Thursday. Read Acts 2:13-41. James Boice calls this sermon "a model sermon" and he says that "the principles that govern the formation of a great sermon must govern the informal witness of the people of God in other situations." If this is true then it would be well to determine what made this a model for us to learn from and follow. Why do you think God blessed this sermon so greatly?

Friday. Read Acts 2:42-47. James Boice uses the word "model" in describing this early church. "It is presented as a model church, but this does not mean that it was perfect. Yet it was a model in many respects and as such is an example for us and our assemblies." Identify the key verse and as many model traits to follow as you can.

Saturday. Pray today for the coming year for the Holy Spirit to work in you deeper reliance upon His Word, and greater obedience for His glory. In preparation for tomorrow's sermon, read Romans 15:20-29. Why should we be zealous to give financially to the church?
