

DAILY DEVOTION

Memory Review Text: Memory Verse: Romans 8:16-17— ¹⁶ The Spirit himself bears witness with our spirit that we are children of God, ¹⁷ and if children, then heirs—heirs of God and fellow heirs with Christ, provided we suffer with him in order that we may also be glorified with him.

Westminster Confession 26.1 "Of the Communion of Saints" All saints, that are united to Jesus Christ their Head, by His Spirit, and by faith, have fellowship with Him in His grace, sufferings, death, resurrection, and glory: and, being united to one another in love, they have communion in each other's gifts and graces, and are obliged to the performance of such duties, public and private, as do conduce to their mutual good, both in the inward and outward man.

Monday: Rom 16:1-16, 21-23. God's church is a family of varied people. Go through these names picking out women, men, wealthy, influential, slaves, prisoners, educated, nurturers, Greeks, Jews, Romans. The gospel (Rom 15:7) calls this diverse group to welcome one another (Rom 16:1, 14:1). How? What kinds of actions and questions will help you relate/ welcome someone different than you (e.g. 20 years old or younger)? What motivates this (Rom 15:7)?

Tuesday: Notice all the "in Christ" or "in the Lord" in Rom 16:1-16. What does that little phrase betray about the church's unity (Rom 6:5, 8:16f, 10:12)? How does this change your perspective on those in your church family who are very different from you? V 5 and v 7 read literally "became in Christ" instead of "converted." That is our ultimate unity (WCF 26.1 above). Set that truth in front of you as you think about New Hope.

Wednesday: Read 1 Cor 12:4-6. A gospel church invests its gifts heavily in and for the other church members. How was the Roman church doing that (Rom 16:1-16, 21-23)? Where do you see their zeal in it? What specific services do you see? Where is the Holy Spirit challenging you to serve the church? Pray for an eagerness to spend yourself for God's people.

Thursday: Read 1 Pet 1:22, Rom 12:9-10. A gospel church loves the diverse family deeply. How is this reflected in Rom 16:1-16, 21-23? What would the equivalent of a "holy kiss" be today? Pray for New Hope to grow in this love. How can you grow in it yourself (v 2, 16)? We love as a response to His love -1 Jn 4:19.

Friday: How are Rom 16:1-16, 21-23 an outworking of the theme of Romans (1:16-17)? Praise God for how he binds together very different people, and has for centuries. Consider what the new heavens and earth will be like (Rev 7:4-12). Keep this in mind as you live with God's varied church.

Saturday: Why might Paul interrupt his greetings with Romans 16:17-20? Think about being "wise as to what is good, and innocent as to what is evil."
