Call to Worship — Romans 8:9-17

⁹You, however, are not in the flesh but in the Spirit, if in fact the Spirit of God dwells in you. Anyone who does not have the Spirit of Christ does not belong to him. ¹⁰But if Christ is in you, although the body is dead because of sin, the Spirit is life because of righteousness. ¹¹If the Spirit of him who raised Jesus from the dead dwells in you, he who raised Christ Jesus from the dead will also give life to your mortal bodies through his Spirit who dwells in you.

¹²So then, brothers, we are debtors, not to the flesh, to live according to the flesh. ¹³For if you live according to the flesh you will die, but if by the Spirit you put to death the deeds of the body, you will live. ¹⁴For all who are led by the Spirit of God are sons of God. ¹⁵For you did not receive the spirit of slavery to fall back into fear, but you have re-

¹⁶ The Spirit himself bears witness with our spirit that we are children of God, ¹⁷ and if children, then heirs—heirs of God and fellow heirs with Christ, provided we suffer with him in order that we may also be glorified with him.

Scripture Reading — Romans 8:18-30 (responsive)

¹⁸ For I consider that the sufferings of this present time are not worth comparing with the glory that is to be revealed to us. ¹⁹ **For the creation waits with eager longing for the revealing of the sons of God.**

²⁰ For the creation was subjected to futility, not willingly, but because of him who subjected it, in hope ²¹ that the creation itself will be set free from its bondage to corruption and obtain the freedom of the glory of the children of God. ²² For we know that the whole creation has been groaning together in the pains of childbirth until now. ²³ **And not only the creation, but we ourselves, who have the firstfruits of the Spirit, groan inwardly as we wait eagerly for adoption as sons, the redemption of our bodies.** ²⁴ For in this hope we were saved. Now hope that is seen is not hope. For who hopes for what he sees? ²⁵ But if we hope for what we do not see, we wait for it with patience.

²⁶ **Likewise the Spirit helps us in our weakness.** For we do not know what to pray for as we ought, but the Spirit himself intercedes for us

with groanings too deep for words. ²⁷ And he who searches hearts knows what is the mind of the Spirit, because the Spirit intercedes for the saints according to the will of God. ²⁸ **And we know that for those who love God all things work together for good, for those who are called according to his purpose.** ²⁹ For those whom he foreknew he also predestined to be conformed to the image of his Son, in order that he might be the firstborn among many brothers. ³⁰ And those whom he predestined he also called, and those whom he called he also justified, and those whom he justified he also glorified.

³⁴ Who is to condemn? Christ Jesus is the one who died—more than that, who was raised—who is at the right hand of God, who indeed is interceding for us. ³⁵ **Who shall separate us from the love of Christ?** Shall tribulation, or distress, or persecution, or famine, or nakedness, or danger, or sword? ³⁶ As it is written,

“For your sake we are being killed all the day long;
we are regarded as sheep to be slaughtered.”

³⁷ No, in all these things we are more than conquerors through him who loved us. ³⁸ **For I am sure that neither death nor life, nor angels nor rulers, nor things present nor things to come, nor powers, ³⁹ nor height nor depth, nor anything else in all creation, will be able to separate us from the love of God in Christ Jesus our Lord.**





DAILY DEVOTION

Memory Verse — Romans 8:28: ²⁸ And we know that for those who love God all things work together for good, for those who are called according to his purpose.

Westminster Confession 14.2 By this faith, a Christian believes to be true whatever is revealed in the Word, for the authority of God Himself speaking in it; and acts differently upon that which each particular passage in it contains; yielding obedience to the commands, trembling at the threatenings, and embracing the promises of God for this life, and that which is to come. But the principal acts of saving faith are accepting, receiving, and resting upon Christ alone for justification, sanctification, and eternal life, by virtue of the covenant of grace.

Monday: Compare Rom 16:25 and Rom 1:11. “Strengthen” here is to strengthen inwardly, establish, fix firmly in place. How has Romans strengthened you in your faith (against error, e.g. Rom 3:27, 14:1), in your holiness (against temptation, e.g. Rom 6:11, 8:1), and in your courage (Rom 8:35)? Who does this strengthening? Pray for it!

Tuesday: Rom 16:25. What means does God use for this strengthening (1:16-17, 10:14-17)? What must preaching focus on? How does the gospel simply open up the glory, grace, and goodness of Jesus for you (Rom 3:23-25, 5:1, 8:11, 18, 32, 39)? How do Jesus and his work strengthen, change, motivate you?

Wednesday: Rom 16:25-26. What was the “mystery kept secret for long ages” (Col 2:2, 1:27)? Does “kept secret” mean Christ is not present in the Old Testament (Lk 24:25-27, Is 53)? How have Jesus and the gospel now been disclosed (1:2ff, 3:21f), and made known to all nations (11:11, Eph 3:6ff, 7:19f)? This theme of a united church sharing the gospel with the nations comes out again -how can you take part in this?

Thursday: According to the last phrase in Rom 16:26, what is the goal of the gospel (1:5)? What does the “obedience of faith” part emphasize (Rom 3:25, 10:16)? What does the “obedience of faith” part emphasize (6:17-19, 12:1-2)? Where is God challenging you to more faith and obedience? Pray urgently for his power to work this in you, in New Hope, and beyond.

Friday: How does Rom 16:25-27 underline that salvation is all of grace? What do you think the emphasis on God’s wisdom is calling to mind (11:6, 32-36, 3:29)? How does salvation being of the Lord cause God to get all the glory? What does that do for our pride, and for our thankfulness? Glorify, exult, and praise God for his salvation, grace, wisdom, power, and condescension. Maybe you can sing about it.

Saturday: Read 1 Kings 18:41-46. What does this teach us about prayer?
