#### Sermon Text — 1 Samuel 24

When Saul returned from following the Philistines, he was told. "Behold, David is in the wilderness of Engedi." <sup>2</sup>Then Saul took three thousand chosen men out of all Israel and went to seek David and his men in front of the Wildgoats' Rocks. <sup>3</sup> And he came to the sheepfolds by the way, where there was a cave, and Saul went in to relieve himself. Now David and his men were sitting in the innermost parts of the cave. <sup>4</sup> And the men of David said to him. "Here is the day of which the Lord said to you, 'Behold, I will give your enemy into your hand, and you shall do to him as it shall seem good to you." Then David arose and stealthily cut off a corner of Saul's robe. 5 And afterward David's heart struck him, because he had cut off a corner of Saul's robe. <sup>6</sup>He said to his men, "The Lord forbid that I should do this thing to my lord, the Lord's anointed, to put out my hand against him, seeing he is the Lord's anointed." 7So David persuaded his men with these words and did not permit them to attack Saul. And Saul rose up and left the cave and went on his wav.

8 Afterward David also arose and went out of the cave, and called after Saul, "My lord the king!" And when Saul looked behind him, David bowed with his face to the earth and paid homage. <sup>9</sup> And David said to Saul, "Why do you listen to the words of men who say, 'Behold, David seeks your harm'? 10 Behold, this day your eyes have seen how the Lord gave you today into my hand in the cave. And some told me to kill you, but I spared you. I said, 'I will not put out my hand against my lord, for he is the Lord's anointed.' 11 See, my father, see the corner of your robe in my hand. For by the fact that I cut off the corner of your robe and did not kill you, you may know and see that there is no wrong or treason in my hands. I have not sinned against you, though you hunt my life to take it. 12 May the Lord judge between me and you, may the Lord avenge me against you, but my hand shall not be against you. <sup>13</sup> As the proverb of the ancients says, 'Out of the wicked comes wickedness.' But my hand shall not be against you. 14 After whom has the king of Israel come out? After whom do you pursue? After a dead dog! After a flea! 15 May the Lord therefore be judge and give sentence between me and you, and see to it and plead my cause and deliver me from

<sup>16</sup> As soon as David had finished speaking these words to Saul, Saul said, "Is this your voice, my son David?" And Saul lifted up his voice and wept. <sup>17</sup> He said to David, "You are more righteous than I, for you have repaid me good, whereas I have repaid you evil. <sup>18</sup> And you have declared this day how you have dealt well with me, in that you did not kill me when the Lord put me into your hands. <sup>19</sup> For if a man finds his enemy, will he let him go away safe? So may the Lord

reward you with good for what you have done to me this day. <sup>20</sup> And now, behold, I know that you shall surely be king, and that the kingdom of Israel shall be established in your hand. <sup>21</sup> Swear to me therefore by the Lord that you will not cut off my offspring after me, and that you will not destroy my name out of my father's house." <sup>22</sup> And David swore this to Saul. Then Saul went home, but David and his men went up to the stronghold.



## DAILY DEVOTION

Memory Text — 1 Samuel 16:7b — <sup>7</sup> But the LORD said to Samuel, "Do not look on his appearance or on the height of his stature, because I have rejected him. For the LORD sees not as man sees: man looks on the outward appearance, but the LORD looks on the heart.

**Heidelberg Catechism 107** But is it enough that we do not kill any man in the manner mentioned above (re: "you shall not murder")? No: for when God forbids envy, hatred, and anger, he commands us to love our neighbour as ourselves; to show patience, peace, meekness, mercy, and all kindness, towards him, and prevent his hurt as much as in us lies; and that we do good, even to our enemies.

**Monday:** 1 Sam 24:1-4. How can you argue from David's, then his men's perspective that this is God's providence to remove Saul (cf 16:13, 22:16-18)? What is the trouble with "reading providence"? Where do you tend to rely on your own short cuts, timing, and methods to get what you want? Pray about this, asking God to help you trust his timing and plans.

**Tuesday**: 1 Sam 24:4-7. David is tempted to kill but resists. Why (v 6, Ps 57:1-3)? How is Jesus' resistance to temptation similar (Mt 4:8-10)? How can you resist temptation in Jesus' strength (1 Cor 10:13, Eph 6:10ff, James 1:13-17)? If cutting off the robe is symbolic of David claiming (part of) the kingdom, why might his conscience be smitten?

**Wednesday:** 1 Sam 24:7-19. Compare Saul and David regarding who they listen to, righteousness/evil, good/bad, mercy/rage. How does this text make the subtle point about who is the qualified king? Think of specific ways King Jesus far surpasses David in these characteristics (Mt 5:43ff, Rom 5:10, Mk 6:34, Eph 2:4ff). Plan specific places where you can grow in such character.

**Thursday:** 1 Sam 24:11-15. Look at David's robust view of God's justice, and his entrusting himself to him who judges justly (Rom 12:19, like Jesus: 1 Pet 2:23). How does this give him patience to wait on God, and to resist taking matters into his own hands? Has there been a time in your life where you needed confidence that God is God of justice?

**Friday:** 1 Sam 24:16-22. How does Saul respond to David's mercy? How long does it last? How might Saul's acknowledgement in v 20 serve to encourage David in a hard time? How does your firm future hope (1 Pet 1:8-9, 13) help you on your pilgrimage and in times of struggle and suffering?

**Saturday:** 2 Sam 1:1-16. How does David respond when God takes out Saul?

#### **Invitation to the Lord's Supper**

Since it is our privilege today to celebrate the blessed sacrament of the Lord's Supper, we are called to prepare our hearts by rightly examining ourselves.

"Do This in Remembrance of Me," says Jesus as He invites us to His Holy Supper. It is not only a privilege, but also a personal responsibility to respond to this gracious invitation. The apostle Paul alerts us to this responsibility in 1 Corinthians 11:27, "Therefore, whoever eats the bread or drinks the cup of the Lord in an unworthy manner will be guilty of sinning against the body and blood of the Lord." Furthermore, the Lord, through the Apostle Paul also instructs us that those who eat and drink "without recognizing the body of the Lord eats and drinks judgement on himself."

In light of the scriptural teaching, the elders invite you to join in the communion celebration on the basis of the following personal affirmations:

- 1. I confess that I am a sinner and repent of my sins.
- 2. I have been baptized into the name of the Father, the Son and the Holy Spirit.
- 3. I believe in Jesus as my Savior and Lord who forgives all my sins because of His sacrifice.
- 4. I desire to show my thankfulness to God by resolving to live in faith and obedience before my Lord, and in love and peace with my neighbors.
- 5. I have made a public profession of faith in a church that recognizes the sovereign authority of God's Word and that we are saved only by grace through faith in Jesus Christ.
- 6. I am not under the discipline of my home church.

If, for some reason, you do not believe you should partake of communion with God's people at this time, the elders would then urge you to refrain from participating today and they would also urge you to actively seek out either one of the elders or the pastor for further instruction. They are eager and willing to discuss these matters in light of God's Word, as they are called to tend to these matters for the purity of Christ's Church, His Glory, and the good of His people.

We are confident that the Savior accepts us at His table when we come in faith, with sorrow for our sins, and with a will to follow Him as He commands.
