

Sermon Text — 2 Samuel 1:1-16

After the death of Saul, when David had returned from striking down the Amalekites, David remained two days in Ziklag. ² And on the third day, behold, a man came from Saul's camp, with his clothes torn and dirt on his head. And when he came to David, he fell to the ground and paid homage. ³ David said to him, "Where do you come from?" And he said to him, "I have escaped from the camp of Israel." ⁴ And David said to him, "How did it go? Tell me." And he answered, "The people fled from the battle, and also many of the people have fallen and are dead, and Saul and his son Jonathan are also dead." ⁵ Then David said to the young man who told him, "How do you know that Saul and his son Jonathan are dead?" ⁶ And the young man who told him said, "By chance I happened to be on Mount Gilboa, and there was Saul leaning on his spear, and behold, the chariots and the horsemen were close upon him. ⁷ And when he looked behind him, he saw me, and called to me. And I

answered, 'Here I am.' ⁸ And he said to me, 'Who are you?' I answered him, 'I am an Amalekite.' ⁹ And he said to me, 'Stand beside me and kill me, for anguish has seized me, and yet my life still lingers.' ¹⁰ So I stood beside him and killed him, because I was sure that he could not live after he had fallen. And I took the crown that was on his head and the armband that was on his arm, and I have brought them here to my lord."

¹¹ Then David took hold of his clothes and tore them, and so did all the men who were with him. ¹² And they mourned and wept and fasted until evening for Saul and for Jonathan his son and for the people of the Lord and for the house of Israel, because they had fallen by the sword. ¹³ And David said to the young man who told him, "Where do you come from?" And he answered, "I am the son of a sojourner, an Amalekite." ¹⁴ David said to him, "How is it you were not afraid to put out your hand to destroy the Lord's anointed?" ¹⁵ Then David called one of the young men and said, "Go, execute him." And he struck him down so that he died. ¹⁶ And David said to him, "Your blood be on your head, for your own mouth has testified against you, saying, 'I have killed the Lord's anointed.'"

DAILY DEVOTION

Memory Text 2 Samuel 1:16. *And David said to him, “Your blood be on your head, for your own mouth has testified against you, saying, ‘I have killed the Lord’s anointed.’”*

Westminster Confession — Chapter VIII. III: The Lord Jesus, in his human nature thus united to the divine, was sanctified and anointed with the Holy Spirit above measure; having in him all the treasures of wisdom and knowledge.

Monday: 2 Samuel 1:1-3. What had the Lord commanded King Saul to do with the Amalekites? (see 1 Samuel 15:1-3). Why does the Lord command Saul to carry this out? How complete is the triumph of the Anointed One over the enemies of God’s people? How does this give us hope in the battle against sin and death?

Tuesday: 2 Samuel 1:11-12 What is David’s response to the news of Saul and Jonathan’s death? How does this point us to Jesus as the Anointed One of God? How does Jesus respond to our sin and its results? (see John 11:35,36)

Wednesday: 2 Samuel 1:14-16 Saul and David are called the Lord’s anointed. *Anointed* in these passages in 2 Sam. is the same word that is used of Jesus the *Messiah*. What did it mean for Saul and then David to be anointed of the Lord? How does this impact our understanding of the baptism of Jesus/ his temptation in the wilderness? (see Matt. 3:13-17; Mark 1:9-11; Luke 4:1-2; John 1:29-34).

Thursday: 2 Samuel 1:14-16. How is it then that Paul says in 2 Corinthians 1:21

And it is God who establishes us with you in Christ, and has anointed us, and who has also put his seal on us and given us his Spirit in our hearts as a guarantee. How is this connected to anointed in 2 Sam 1, Jesus being anointed, and now here in 2 Cor 1:21?

Friday: 2 Sam. 1:11-16. How does David and his actions help us to understand what a righteous king looks like? What does this say about Jesus Christ as David’s heir? How do David’s actions give you comfort and hope in Jesus?

Saturday: read over 2 Sam 1:17-27. See how the Righteous King laments our fallenness and give thanks for His triumph over sin and death.
