

Sermon Text — James 5:1-12

Come now, you rich, weep and howl for the miseries that are coming upon you. ²Your riches have rotted and your garments are motheaten. ³Your gold and silver have corroded, and their corrosion will be evidence against you and will eat your flesh like fire. You have laid up treasure in the last days. ⁴Behold, the wages of the laborers who mowed your fields, which you kept back by fraud, are crying out against you, and the cries of the harvesters have reached the ears of the Lord of hosts. ⁵You have lived on the earth in luxury and in selfindulgence. You have fattened your hearts in a day of slaughter. ⁶You have condemned and murdered the righteous person. He does not resist you.

⁷ Be patient, therefore, brothers, until the coming of the Lord. See how the farmer waits for the precious fruit of the earth, being patient about it, until it receives the early and the late rains. ⁸You also, be patient. Establish your hearts, for the coming of the Lord is at hand. ⁹Do not grumble against one another, brothers, so that you may not be judged; behold, the Judge is standing at the door. ¹⁰As an example of suffering and patience, brothers, take the prophets who spoke in the name of the Lord. ¹¹Behold, we consider those blessed who remained steadfast. You have heard of the steadfastness of Job, and you have seen the purpose of the Lord, how the Lord is compassionate and merciful. ¹²But above all, my brothers, do not swear, either by heaven or by earth or by any other oath, but let your "yes" be yes and your "no" be no, so that you may not fall under condemnation.

DAILY DEVOTION

Memory Text — James 5:8 — You also, be patient. Establish your hearts, for the coming of the Lord is at hand.

Westminster Larger Catechism (WLC 43): *How does Christ execute the office of a prophet?* Christ executes the office of a prophet, in his revealing to the church, in all ages, by his Spirit and word, in diverse ways of administration, the whole will of God, in all things concerning their edification and salvation.

Monday: James 5:1–4. James is not pulling any punches here. Why do you think he is using such strong prophetic imagery to denounce the rich? To what event is he pointing the rich? Where is the hope in this passage? What does verse 4 say about the character of God? What does it say about the care for His people? [e.g. Prov. 11:28; Amos 6:1].

Tuesday: James 5:5. How did Jesus view the rich to whom James is speaking? [e.g. Luke 6:19,20,24; Luke 12:21]. Does Jesus condemn *all* who are rich? [e.g. Genesis 13:12; Job 42:10; Luke 19:1–10] Then to what problem is James pointing out in the rich? How should we who are already in Christ hear these warnings? [e.g. 1 Tim. 6:9; 1 Tim. 5:6].

Wednesday: James 5:6. There has been much debate among scholars whether James is referring to the innocent pilgrims or to the truly Innocent One, Jesus. How does the work of the Spirit in our lives the implications of both thoughts? [i.e. James 4:2; Acts 3:18,19].

Thursday: James 5:7–11. What is the fruit of the Holy Spirit that James is exhorting us to bring forth in these times in which we live? Another word for "establish" in verse 8 is "strengthen." How can we strengthen our hearts? [e.g. 1 Cor. 1:8; 1 Thess. 3:12,13]. To what is the Spirit here pointing our attention in order to keep us focused on Christ? How does this differ for the pilgrim as compared to the rich James has already addressed? To whom is James presenting as examples for us?

Friday: James 5:12. Why is James exhorting us to not swear an oath here? What is his point underneath this warning? Remember that James is wisdom literature (e.g. Proverbs, Ecclesiastes). How does that affect our interpretation of this passage? How should this inform the way we speak to one another? [e.g. Eph. 4:25] How is what James saying like the example we find in Mark 14:66–72? How is it different to Paul's statement in 1 Thess. 5:27? Compare this to Hebrews 6:13–18.

Saturday: Read 2 Sam 4. Consider the actions in this chapter in light of v 9. Pray for tomorrow's worship service.
