## The Gospel — Ephesians 2:1-10

And you were dead in the trespasses and sins <sup>2</sup> in which you once walked, following the course of this world, following the prince of the power of the air, the spirit that is now at work in the sons of disobedience—<sup>3</sup> among whom we all once lived in the passions of our flesh, carrying out the desires of the body and the mind, and were by nature children of wrath, like the rest of mankind. <sup>4</sup>But God, being rich in mercy, because of the great love with which he loved us, <sup>5</sup> even when we were dead in our trespasses, made us alive together with Christ-by grace vou have been saved— 6 and raised us up with him and seated us with him in the heavenly places in Christ Jesus, <sup>7</sup> so that in the coming ages he might show the immeasurable riches of his grace in kindness toward us in Christ Jesus. <sup>8</sup>For by grace you have been saved through faith. And this is not your own doing; it is the gift of God, 9 not a result of works, so that no one may boast. <sup>10</sup> For we are his workmanship, created in Christ Jesus for good works, which God prepared beforehand, that we should walk in them.

# Sermon Text — 2 Samuel 7:18-29

<sup>18</sup>Then King David went in and sat before the LORD and said, "Who am I, O Lord GOD, and what is my house, that you have brought me thus far? <sup>19</sup> And yet this was a small thing in your eyes, O Lord GOD. You have spoken also of your servant's house for a great while to come, and this is instruction for mankind, O Lord GOD! 20 And what more can David say to you? For you know your servant, O Lord GOD! <sup>21</sup> Because of your promise, and according to your own heart, you have brought about all this greatness, to make your servant know it. <sup>22</sup> Therefore you are great, O LORD God. For there is none like you, and there is no God besides you, according to all that we have heard with our ears. <sup>23</sup> And who is like your people Israel, the one nation on earth whom God went to redeem to be his people, making himself a name and doing for them great and awesome things by driving out before your people, whom you redeemed for yourself from Egypt, a nation and its gods? <sup>24</sup> And you established for yourself your people Israel to be your people forever. And you, O LORD, became their God. <sup>25</sup> And now, O LORD God. confirm forever the word that you have spoken concerning your servant and concerning his house, and do as you have spoken.<sup>26</sup> And your name will be magnified forever, saying, 'The LORD of hosts is God over Israel,' and the house of your servant David will be established before you. <sup>27</sup> For you, O LORD of hosts, the God of Israel, have made this revelation to your servant, saying, 'I will build you a house.' Therefore your servant has found courage to pray this prayer to you. <sup>28</sup> And now, O Lord GOD, you are God, and your words are true, and you have promised this good thing to your servant. <sup>29</sup> Now therefore may it please you to bless the house of your servant, so that it may continue forever before you. For you, O Lord GOD, have spoken, and with your blessing shall the house of your servant be blessed forever."

# DAILY DEVOTION

**Memory Text** — 2 Samuel 7:12-13 <sup>12</sup> When your days are fulfilled and you lie down with your fathers, I will raise up your offspring after you, who shall come from your body, and I will establish his kingdom. <sup>13</sup> He shall build a house for my name, and I will establish the throne of his kingdom forever.

**Westminster Confession of Faith 7.1** The distance between God and the creature is so great, that although reasonable creatures do owe obedience unto Him as their Creator, yet they could never have any fruition of Him as their blessedness and reward, but by some voluntary condescension on God's part, which He has been pleased to express by way of covenant.

**Monday:** How did Saul respond when Samuel confronted him in 1 Sam 13:10f? How does David respond in 2 Sam 7:18 (cf v 2, 4)? How do you see David's humility in vv 18-19 (v 8)? How does remembering God's grace to us in the past move us to humility and praise? Don't try to produce humility in yourself -look long at God's greatness and holiness (ch 6) and his grace to you.

**Tuesday**: What had God promised David in vv 11-16? How does David understand this according to 2 Sam 7:23-24? How does he tie it to the Exodus event (cf Ex 6:7)? How does he tie it to the Abrahamic covenant (Gen 17:7-8)? Consider God's actions in vv 23-24. How has Christ done this for you? Marvel at the initiative of God in your salvation. Consider your high privilege to be called his!! (1 Pet 2:9-10)

**Wednesday:** 2 Sam 7:20-23. What moves David to such exaltation? Is this simply praise for God's blessing to him personally? Dale R. Davis writes: "Yahweh's declarations stirred David's devotions; his promises ignited David's praises and prayers." Does God's word stir that kind of response in you (if not, look at Rom 8, or Eph 2:1-10, 1 Pet 1, Ps 103)?

**Thursday:** What does David ask God to do in vv 25-27? Is it any wonder that David pleads with God to keep his promise, given what the promise signifies (vv 23-24)?

"Prayer pleads God's promises." How should this shape how you pray? Spend some time praying some of God's promises right now (e.g. Ezek 36:20-23, Ps 46:1, Rom 8:1f, Jn 14:3)

**Friday:** 2 Sam 7:28-29. How many times do "bless" and "forever" come up in these verses? How far does David's prayer for God's blessing through his house/dynasty extend? Look at Mt 5:1-12 and Eph 1:3 to see how David's Royal Son brings blessing to his people. Praise him for such blessings, bask in them, and pray that he extends them to the nations.

**Saturday:** Read 2 Samuel 8 and ponder how this passage is a preview for King Jesus' kingdom.
