DAILY DEVOTION

Memory Text James 1:2 — ²Count it all joy, my brothers, when you meet trials of various kinds,

Westminster Larger Catechism 76—Repentance unto life is a saving grace, wrought in the heart of a sinner by the Spirit and Word of God, whereby, out of the sight and sense, not only of the danger, but also of the filthiness and odiousness of his sins, and upon the apprehension of God's mercy in Christ to such as are penitent, he so grieves for and hates his sins, as that he turns from them all to God, purposing and endeavoring constantly to walk with him in all the ways of new obedience.

Monday: James 1:1. Who was James (Gal 1:19)? What did he think of Jesus early in his life (Mk 3:21, Jn 7:5)? How can he say "servant of the Lord Jesus Christ" now? What happened (1 Cor 15:7)? Are you a bond -servant, bound, indebted, and redeemed by Jesus? Give thanks to him. Maybe sing about it!

Tuesday: James 1:1. James was Jesus' half brother (bragging right?). What do you learn from the following texts about his influence and position in the early church: Gal 1:19, 2:9, Acts 15:13-22? Yet despite all of this, how does he refer to himself? What do you learn about humility (and grow in) from James here (Phil 2:1-8)?

Wednesday: James 1:1. James refers to himself as a "servant of God" and the Lord Jesus Christ. This certainly includes the idea of worshipping the Triune God. However, it also includes the idea of submission to the will of the Master, through his Word (like Paul, Acts 22:10). Do you actively apply God's Word? Do you read it to be changed and challenged by it, or do you run by what you feel is right? See James 1:18, 21, 22 for James' development of this.

Thursday: James 1:1. When were the twelve tribes scattered (dispersed), and what did God promise them (Is 11:11-12, Jer 31:8-14)? "James here claims the NT believers constitute the true people of God in 'the last days." How does Jesus gather the scattered people of God? According to Jesus, who are the true "twelve tribes" (Mt 19:28, see also 1 Pet 1:1)?

Friday: Do you think of yourself as dispersed, scattered, in exile (James 1:1)? How does that set your expectations for this life? Think about (or flip through) James, asking yourself "how does James give wisdom for wilderness-wandering? What does he emphasize? What is the home-land you are seeking to wisely walk toward?

Saturday: James 1:2-4. Compare how do you view trials to this text.
