#### Confession of Sin — Romans 2:17-23, 3:20

<sup>17</sup> But if you call yourself a Jew and rely on the law and boast in God <sup>18</sup> and know his will and approve what is excellent, because you are instructed from the law; <sup>19</sup> and if you are sure that you yourself are a guide to the blind, a light to those who are in darkness, <sup>20</sup> an instructor of the foolish, a teacher of children, having in the law the embodiment of knowledge and truth— <sup>21</sup> you then who teach others, do you not teach yourself? While you preach against stealing, do you steal? <sup>22</sup> You who say that one must not commit adultery, do you commit adultery? ## DAILY DEVOTION

Memory Text: James 2:8 — <sup>8</sup> If you really fulfill the royal law according to the Scripture, "You shall love your neighbor as yourself," you are doing well. <sup>9</sup> But if you show partiality, you are committing sin and are convicted by the law as transgressors.

**Westminster Confession of Faith 19.5** The moral law does forever bind all, as well justified persons as others, to the obedience thereof; and that, not only in regard of the matter contained in it, but also in respect of the authority of God the Creator, who gave it. Neither does Christ, in the Gospel, any way dissolve, but much strengthen this obligation.

**Monday:** James 2:8. The "Royal Law" is the King's law, the kingly, the kingdom law. What is the heart of Jesus law (Mt 22:36-40)? How does Jesus fill out this kingdom law (Mt 5:21ff)? How does Jesus fulfill it on our behalf (Rom 8:1-3)? By what are Jesus' kingdom citizens to be marked? Does this exclude obedience to the 10 commandments (see v 9-11, see "love" in Lev 19:18, 1 Jn 5:2f)? What neighbors are you loving "as yourself"?

**Tuesday**: James 2:8-9. What does James contrast between v 8 and 9? What is their specific sin? How do you unjustly judge, think about, and mistreat those around you based on what they drive, how they vote, etc? Does racism and disdain for immigrants fit into this? How is partiality a sin against love, loving your neighbor? How does the gospel challenge such partiality (2:5)?

**Wednesday:** James 2:9-11. James' folks seemed to minimize partiality as not too big a deal. Do you think it's a "major" sin? Why is it a big deal according to our text? Why is conviction of specific sins, and repentance thereof, essential for Christians? Why, according to vv 10-11, can Christians not pick and choose which laws to obey? Pray for a whole-hearted, and more life-encompassing obedience.

**Thursday:** James 2:12. Now the "royal law" has become the "law of liberty." How has Jesus freed us from the "must obey" to the "desire to obey" (Mt 18:32-35, Jn 14:15)? How has he given us the power and will to obey (Gal 3:3, 5:16, 22, 25)? What specific ways will you speak, and what specific ways will you act, that demonstrate love for neighbor this week?

**Friday:** James 2:13. How important is evidence of love for Christ according to this verse? How does God's mercy triumph over judgment in the cross (2 Cor 5:21, Eph 2:4-6)? How does your mercy-love triumph over judgment-partiality? How does James press this home with v 13's warning?

Saturday: What is James' main point in James 2:14-26?
