

DAILY DEVOTION

Memory Verse: Romans 12:12a ¹² Rejoice in hope, be patient in tribulation...

Heidelberg Catechism 107. But is it enough that we do not kill any man in the manner mentioned above [i.e. you shall not murder]? No: for when God forbids envy, hatred, and anger, he commands us to love our neighbor as ourselves; to show patience, peace, meekness, mercy, and all kindness, towards him, and prevent his hurt as much as in us lies; and that we do good, even to our enemies.

Monday: Read Luke 12:13-21, and 1 Timothy 6:17-19. How can I evaluate where I am putting my hope? As I think about income, savings, investments, insurance, and so on, how do I know if I am being responsible or if I am putting my hope in these things? If my true hope is really with Christ in God, how can I show that more with my resources?

Tuesday: Read Colossians 3:1-3. What do I most think about: things of earth or things in heaven? What do I mainly long for or seek? How does my attitude towards my home and possessions indicate where my hope really is? What false hopes do I need to expose to myself? What can/should I do today to put my hope more fully in the grace that will come in the future?

Wednesday: Read II Corinthians 6:1-10. In the midst of all the suffering described here, why can these apostles have joy? How can I similarly rejoice in the midst of hard circumstances? How can I focus my heart rightly during good times, so that in bad times, my heart can respond sorrowfully, "yet always rejoicing"?

Thursday: Read II Corinthians 5:1-10. How does this affect my thoughts and actions in regard to fitness and health? How can this help me as I consider the effects of aging? How should this affect my attitude towards what risks I am willing to take for the Kingdom of God? Do I have false hopes I am clinging to in this area?

Friday: Read Matthew 5:1-12. What are the rewards promised here? To whom are those rewards promised? How can I live more fully the way Jesus describes because of the hope he gives us in these verses?

Saturday: Read Psalm 73:23-26. Use it as a guide to your prayer, that your hope would be like that of the psalmist, and that you would rejoice in that hope.
