

DAILY DEVOTION

Belgic Confession Article 34, "Of Holy Baptism — Therefore he has commanded all those, who are his, to be baptized with pure water, "in the name of the Father, and of the Son, and of the Holy Spirit": thereby signifying to us, that as water washes away the filth of the body, when poured upon it, and is seen on the body of the baptized, when sprinkled upon him; so doth the blood of Christ, by the power of the Holy Spirit, internally sprinkle the soul, cleanse it from its sins, and regenerate us from children of wrath, unto children of God. Not that this is effected by the external water, but by the sprinkling of the precious blood of the Son of God; who is our Red Sea, through which we must pass, to escape the tyranny of Pharaoh, that is, the devil, and to enter into the spiritual land of Canaan. Therefore the ministers, on their part, administer the sacrament, and that which is visible, but our Lord gives that which is signified by the sacrament, namely, the gifts and invisible grace; washing, cleansing and purging our souls of all filth and unrighteousness; renewing our hearts, and filling them with all comfort; giving unto us a true assurance of his fatherly goodness; putting on us the new man, and putting off the old man with all his deeds.

Monday: The bronze basin (laver) described in Ex 30:17-21 was called "The Sea" in 1 Kings 7:23. Consider the calm "sea" in Gen 2:10ff, the judgment sea in Gen 6:17, the salvation-judgment waters of Ex 15:1-4, 13. What reminders (1 Pet 3:20-21, warnings (Heb 12:14, 2 Cor 7:1), and promises (Rev 4:1, 22:1) do you think "The Sea" testified to in the tabernacle?

Tuesday: Ex 30:17-21. What was the first piece of furniture and it's message (Ex 27:1, Rom 3:24-25)? What was the laver for (Ex 30:20)? In what way do believers today still need to be purified and cleansed (2 Cor 7:1)? Both these pieces of furniture are intentionally connected: they're both bronze and in the outer court, and have to be passed before going in to the tabernacle. Why the connection (James 2:17, 1 Jn 3:9f)? Pray that you grow mightily in your sanctification.

Wednesday: Ex 38:8. Of what was the bronze basin made? What does this tell you about the devotion and involvement of these women? How does it point you to the New Testament means of washing (James 1:22-25, Eph 5:26)? Are you thinking through, and praying passages in the Bible? Press them into your life -this is how we grow in purity and cleanness!

Thursday: Consider Ex 30:17-21 from the perspectives of setting apart the priests, and cleansing them for service. How have you been set apart (Titus 3:5)? How must you be regularly cleansed (Eph 5:26, Jn 13:8-10)? As a NT priest (1 Pet 2:9) how will you go about your daily service in the presence of God (1 Pet 2:9-12, 1:13-16)?

Friday: Read Ex 30:17-21 and John 13:3-17. Reread vv 14-16. How will you wash someone's feet this weekend?

Saturday: Pray that God purifies us tomorrow as we see Jesus (1 Jn 3:3).
