Sermon Text — Exodus 30:1-10

"You shall make an altar on which to burn incense; you shall make it of acacia wood. ² A cubit shall be its length, and a cubit its breadth. It shall be square, and two cubits shall be its height. Its horns shall be of one piece with it. ³You shall overlay it with pure gold, its top and around its sides and its horns. And you shall make a molding of gold around it. ⁴ And you shall make two golden rings for it. Under its molding on two opposite sides of it you shall make them, and they shall be holders for poles with which to carry it. 5 You shall make the poles of acacia wood and overlay them with gold. ⁶ And you shall put it in front of the veil that is above the ark of the testimony, in front of the mercy seat that is above the testimony, where I will meet with you. 7 And Aaron shall burn fragrant incense on it. Every morning when he dresses the lamps he shall burn it, 8 and when Aaron sets up the lamps at twilight, he shall burn it, a regular incense offering before the LORD throughout your generations. ⁹You shall not offer unauthorized incense on it, or a burnt offering, or a grain offering, and you shall not pour a drink offering on it. 10 Aaron shall make atonement on its horns once a year. With the blood of the sin offering of atonement he shall make atonement for it once in the year throughout your generations. It is most holy to the LORD."



DAILY DEVOTION

Memory Text: Hebrews 4:14-16 ¹⁴ Since then we have a great high priest who has passed through the heavens, Jesus, the Son of God, let us hold fast our confession. ¹⁵ For we do not have a high priest who is unable to sympathize with our weaknesses, but one who in every respect has been tempted as we are, yet without sin. ¹⁶ Let us then with confidence draw near to the throne of grace, that we may receive mercy and find grace to help in time of need.

Westminster Larger Catechism 181: Why are we to pray in the name of Christ? The sinfulness of man, and his distance from God by reason thereof, being so great, as that we can have no access into his presence without a mediator; and there being none in heaven or earth appointed to, or fit for, that glorious work but Christ alone, we are to pray in no other name but his only.

Monday: Ex 30:1-8. What did the incense altar look like? Of what do its shape and horns remind you (27:1-2)? Where was the altar placed (6)? Why might that be very sober for the priest serving at the altar? How did the incense work (Lev 16:12f)? How would this make the Holy Place smell? How is God's presence fragrant, sweet, and pleasing (e.g. 2 Cor 2:14)?

Tuesday: Ex 30:1, 7-8. For what was this altar used? Did they offer anything else on it (v 8, Lev 10:1ff)? Consider Ps 141:1-2, Lk 1:9, 10, 13, Rev 5:8, 8:3, 4. What did the altar symbolize? Both the people and the priests prayed. Consider how our Living Priest prays for us (Heb 7:25, Rom 8:34, 8:26-28). Praise him for such care and love!

Wednesday: Ex 30:1-10, Ps 141:1-2. In Jesus we stand right before God in all his glory and holiness, and come as a child to his Father. This is a high privilege. Spend some time praying, thanking God for this privilege. Pray through a Psalm, going verse by verse and reflecting on it in prayer to God (maybe Ps 23, or Ps 36).

Thursday: According to Ex 30:10, what had to happen every year? When and how did this happen (Lev 16:34, 11-14)? Why does sin have to be dealt with prior to prayer being heard? How has atonement been made for your sin (Heb 4:14-5:2, 8-9)? Why then do we pray in Jesus' name? In to what does Heb 4:16 invite you? Spend some time before the throne of grace.

Friday: What does God invite his children to do in Ex 30:1-10? If he has provided the way for us to approach him, and adopted us into his family, is there any way he listens half-heartedly, or begrudgingly? Believe that God loves to hear from his children: Ps 40:1, Mt 6:8, Is 49:16, Rom 8:39, Heb 4:14 -16. Go to him in faith that he delights in the prayers of his people.

Saturday: Ex 25:10-22. What makes the ark unique? What did it symbolize?
