

Confession of Sin — Matthew 6:25-34

²⁵ "Therefore I tell you, do not be anxious about your life, what you will eat or what you will drink, nor about your body, what you will put on. Is not life more than food, and the body more than clothing? ²⁶Look at the birds of the air: they neither sow nor reap nor gather into barns, and yet your heavenly Father feeds them. Are you not of more value than they? ²⁷ And which of you by being anxious can add a single hour to his span of life? ²⁸ And why are you anxious about clothina? Consider the lilies of the field, how they grow: they neither toil nor spin, ²⁹ yet I tell you, even Solomon in all his glory was not arrayed like one of these. ³⁰ But if God so clothes the grass of the field, which today is alive and tomorrow is thrown into the oven, will he not much more clothe you, O you of little faith? ³¹ Therefore do not be anxious, saying, 'What shall we eat?' or 'What shall we drink?' or 'What shall we wear?' ³² For the Gentiles seek after all these things, and your heavenly Father knows that you need them all. ³³ But seek first the kingdom of God and his righteousness, and all these things will be added to you.

³² Jesus then said to them, "Truly, truly, I say to you, it was not Moses who gave you the bread from heaven, but my Father gives you the true bread from heaven. ³³ For the bread of God is he who comes down from heaven and gives life to the world." ³⁴ They said to him, "Sir, give us this bread always."

³⁵ Jesus said to them, "I am the bread of life; whoever comes to me shall not hunger, and whoever believes in me shall never thirst. ³⁶ But I said to you that you have seen me and yet do not believe. ³⁷ All that the Father gives me will come to me, and whoever comes to me I will never cast out.

Congregational Prayer

Sermon Text — Exodus 25:23-30; Leviticus 24:5-9

²³ "You shall make a table of acacia wood. Two cubits shall be its length, a cubit its breadth, and a cubit and a half its height. ²⁴ You shall overlay it with pure gold and make a molding of gold around it. ²⁵ And you shall make a rim around it a handbreadth wide, and a molding of gold around the rim. ²⁶ And you shall make for it four rings of gold, and fasten the rings to the four corners at its four legs. ²⁷ Close to the frame the rings shall lie, as holders for the poles to carry the table. ²⁸ You shall make the poles of acacia wood, and overlay them with gold, and the table shall be carried with these. ²⁹ And you shall make its plates and dishes for incense, and its flagons and bowls with which to pour drink offerings; you shall make them of pure gold. ³⁰ And you shall set the bread of the Presence on the table before me regularly.

⁵ "You shall take fine flour and bake twelve loaves from it; two tenths of an ephah shall be in each loaf. ⁶ And you shall set them in two piles, six in a pile, on the table of pure gold before the LORD. ⁷ And you shall put pure frankincense on each pile, that it may go with the bread as a memorial portion as a food offering to the LORD. ⁸ Every Sabbath day Aaron shall arrange it before the LORD regularly; it is from the people of Israel as a covenant forever. ⁹ And it shall be for Aaron and his sons, and they shall eat it in a holy place, since it is for him a most holy portion out of the LORD's food offerings, a perpetual due."

DAILY DEVOTION

Memory Text: Matthew 6:34 ³⁴ "Therefore do not be anxious about tomorrow, for tomorrow will be anxious for itself. Sufficient for the day is its own trouble.

Heidelberg Catechism 75 How are you admonished and assured in the Lord's Supper, that you are a partaker of that one sacrifice of Christ, accomplished on the cross, and of all his benefits? Thus: That Christ has commanded me and all believers, to eat of this broken bread, and to drink of this cup, in remembrance of him, adding these promises: first, that his body was offered and broken on the cross for me, and his blood shed for me, as certainly as I see with my eyes, the bread of the Lord broken for me, and the cup communicated to me; and further, that he feeds and nourishes my soul to everlasting life, with his crucified body and shed blood, as assuredly as I receive from the hands of the minister, and taste with my mouth the bread and cup of the Lord, as certain signs of the body and blood of Christ.

Monday: Ex 25:23-30. Describe the table. Where was it placed? Think about the Table in light of Ex 24:9-11. Whom do you think the 12 loaves on the table (Lev 24:5ff) represented? What do bread of "the Presence" and "before me" in v 30 communicate? Do you see how the Table says "God welcomes us to table-fellowship/relationship/communion with him"? Ponder that truth today.


Tuesday: Ex 25:23-30. Why must the altar and laver come before the table? Picture the banqueting table here, like a family dinner or Thanksgiving feast. Do you believe that God not only forgives you, but welcomes you as his loved family to relationship? Argue this truth into your hearts by looking at: Rev 3:20, Mt 9:10, 11:19, 11:29, 19:14, Lk 5:30, 7:34, Lk 14:15ff, John 15:9, 1 Jn 4:16, Rev 19:9.

Wednesday: Lev 24:5-9. How big are these loaves (5)? Was the table ever empty? Read 2 Ki 2:7, 18:19 to capture the picture of God's provision for all 12 tribes/loaves. In the Table God reminds his people that he provides for their daily bread. How does this truth impact how you think/worry/be anxious about the future (Mt 6:25-34)? Pray and commit (the future) to God.

Thursday: Lev 24:5-9. Through faith in Jesus we are adopted into God's family, and he becomes our loving, providing, welcoming Father (Rom 8:15ff). In that sense Jesus is this Table -from heaven providing for his people -look at Lk 11:11-13, and Eph 4:7-13. Jesus says, "I am the bread of life" (Jn 6:35). He gives what we need for spiritual life, but also physical life. Trust him! Ask him! He is generous, isn't he (Jn 10:11)?

Friday: Lev 24:8 argues this table and its bread is a continual reminder of the covenant (I will be you God, you will be my people). How? The Lord's Supper is also a continual reminder of the covenant (Mt 22:20). How? How does it remind you of both God's spiritual and physical provision, and of the communion/ fellowship we have with God? Muse on God's grace and goodness in this, and let that shape your attitude today.

Saturday: Ex 25:31-40. How is God the light of your life?



The Tabernacle of Moses






Figure 1: Physical Arrangement of the Tabernacle
