⁹ The commandments, "You shall not commit adultery," "You shall not murder," "You shall not steal," "You shall not covet," and whatever other command there may be, are summed up in this one command: "Love your neighbor as yourself." ¹⁰ Love does no harm to a neighbor. Therefore love is the fulfillment of the law.

¹¹ And do this, understanding the present time: The hour has already come for you to wake up from your slumber, because our salvation is nearer now than when we first believed. ¹² The night is nearly over; the day is almost here. So let us put aside the deeds of darkness and put on the armor of light. ¹³ Let us behave decently, as in the daytime, not in carousing and drunkenness, not in sexual immorality and debauchery, not in dissension and jealousy. ¹⁴ Rather, clothe yourselves with the Lord Jesus Christ, and do not think about how to gratify the desires of the flesh.

DAILY DEVOTION

Memory Text: 1 Peter 4:19 — 19 Therefore let those who suffer according to God's will entrust their souls to a faithful Creator while doing good.

Monday: (1 Peter 4:12) The charge given by Peter suggests that his hearers, and you, may naturally tend to think it strange when faced with trial. What is the reason for a Christian's suffering and trial as revealed in this text? How does/can knowing this serve you in regard to facing trial?

Tuesday: (1 Peter 4:13) consider how incredible a thing it is that a Christian's suffering (as a Christian) is a "sharing in Christ's suffering". What affection does this incite? What is the proper response to suffering for doing good? (See also Acts 5:41) do you find this to be a true condition of your heart?

Wednesday: (1 Peter 4:13-15) We are reminded that suffering is also a consequence of wrongdoing and therefore are cautioned that suffering in itself is not assurance of sharing with Christ. Consider what it means to suffer for being a Christian. Do you find trials in your life that, if considered truthfully, are the consequence of sin rather than godliness?

Thursday: (1 Peter 4:14) Why would someone be insulted for the name of Christ? Think about every instance where Christ himself was despised and spoken against. What kind of things did he say in his earthy ministry? How did he say them? Also, What does the Christian have that is made evident while they joy in trial?

Friday: (1 Peter 4:17-18) what will become of the of the ungodly and the sinner and those who do not obey the gospel? Why do you think this is a question that God has appointed us to consider?

Saturday: In light of this message, think about the saints in scripture who serve as witnesses to its truth. How has God been glorified through the suffering of other servants?
