#### Reflections

The fact that God is our refuge and strength does not mean that we are immune from troubles and problems. The abundant life is not a trouble free life. We need to be clear on this because many false teachers today claim that it is God's will for every person to enjoy prosperity and perfect health. But the Bible teaches no such thing. It teaches that God is our help in trouble, not that He will exempt us from trouble.... As our refuge, we can flee to God and find relief and comfort. As our strength, we discover that His strength is made perfect in our weakness as we trust in Him (2 Cor. 12:9). And, God's protection and strength are immediately available ("a very present help") the instant we turn to Him. While He may delay delivering us to show us our absolute need for Him or for reasons we can't understand, we can always have immediate comfort and calm when we flee to God for refuge and strength.

#### **Treasurer's Update**

Bad news/good news/best news time: The bad news is that I must report a deficit in our budgeted giving. We've been in the red on giving based on our \$531,073 budget since the end of June. The good news is that we're significantly underspending our budget, primarily because there is nary an Associate Pastor in sight (a position budgeted for 6 months), so our actual General Fund is in the black. The best news is that "my God will supply every need of yours according to his riches in glory in Christ Jesus" (Phil. 4:19), so New Hope must only need \$322,971.68 at this point. God is good all the time!

## DAILY DEVOTION

**Memory Verse:** Philippians 1:21 <sup>21</sup> For to me to live is Christ, and to die is gain.

**Westminster Confession 26.2** Of the Communion of Saints —Saints by profession are bound to maintain an holy fellowship and communion in the worship of God, and in performing such other spiritual services as tend to their mutual edification; as also in relieving each other in outward things, according to their several abilities and necessities. Which communion, as God offers opportunity, is to be extended unto all those who, in every place, call upon the name of the Lord Jesus.

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**Monday:** Phil 1:3. How thankful is Paul to God for the church? Why (e.g. Eph 2:17-22)? How significant is church to you? Give thanks for specifics that happen in church, and the faith and service of the saints? Were all Paul's "remembrances" happy (Acts 16:22-24, Phil 4:2)? How do you give thanks when there are painful memories (Phil 1:18, 20, 3:8)?

**Tuesday**: Phil 1:4. In light of Phil 1:3-4, how often to you think Paul prayed? What was his focus? How does this challenge you? Paul's prayers were emotional —joy-filled. Does his joy come from circumstances (e.g. 1:14, 4:2)? What is the source of his joy (1:21, 23, 4:4)? Consider your joy, or lack thereof -how much is it tied to your circumstances, versus joy in Jesus?

**Wednesday:** How does Phil 1:5 explain Paul's thankfulness and joy? How does "partnership in the gospel" signal God's glory, character, and mission? Do you see yourself as a "partner in the gospel"? How does that identity give you a higher purpose, and a joint purpose (Phil 1:27)? Consider New Hope -you are gospel partners with the rest of the saints!

**Thursday:** Phil 1:5: Paul's thanks and joy stem from the Philippians being gospel partners with him. How did the Philippians partner in the gospel with Paul (1:7, 19, 27, 29, 2:12, 4:3, 4:15)? They displayed their faith in the gospel in action -are you? What specific things can you point to that display your gospel partnership? This can include praying, discipling your kids, giving, serving, showing hospitality, discipling, etc.

**Friday:** Phil 1:3-5. Consider different aspects of service in the church like Growth Groups, Sunday School, nursery, ushering, etc. How are these part of "gospel partnership"? How does that move them from being simply a "duty" to something you can give thanks for, and take joy in? Although it's costly to serve, it has eternal significance (Mt 25:34f, 1 Pet 4:11)!

Saturday: Phil 1:6-8. Where does Paul ground Christian assurance?
