Reflections

It is ever the Holy Spirit's work to turn our eyes away from self to Jesus; but Satan's work is just the opposite of this, for he is constantly trying to make us regard ourselves instead of Christ. He insinuates, "your sins are too great for pardon; you have no faith; you do not repent enough; you will never be able to continue to the end; you have not the joy of His children; you have such a wavering hold of Jesus." All these are thoughts about self and we shall never find comfort or assurance by looking within. But the Holy Spirit turns our eyes entirely away from self. He tells us that we are nothing, but that "Christ is all in all."

Remember, therefore, it is not thy hold of Christ that saves thee--it is Christ; it is not thy joy in Christ that saves thee--it is Christ; it is not even faith in Christ, though that be the instrument--it is Christ's blood and merits; therefore, look not so much to thy hand with which thou art grasping Christ, as to Christ; look not to thy hope, but to Jesus, the source of thy hope; look not to thy faith, but to Jesus, the author and finisher of thy faith.

We shall never find happiness by looking at our prayers, our doings, or our feelings; it is what Jesus is, not what we are, that gives rest to the soul. If we would at once overcome Satan and have peace with God, it must be by "looking unto Jesus." Keep thine eye simply on Him; let His death, His sufferings, His merits, His glories, His intercession, be fresh upon thy mind; when thou wakest in the morning look to Him; when thou liest down at night look to Him. Oh! let not thy hopes or fears come between thee and Jesus; follow hard after Him, and He will never fail thee.

DAILY DEVOTION

Memory Verse: Philippians 2:1-2 — So if there is any encouragement in Christ, any comfort from love, any participation in the Spirit, any affection and sympathy, ² complete my joy by being of the same mind, having the same love, being in full accord and of one mind.

Westminster Shorter Catechism 31: What is effectual calling? *Effectual calling is the work of God's Spirit, whereby convincing us of our sin and misery, enlightening our minds in the knowledge of Christ, and renewing our wills, he doth persuade and enable us to embrace Jesus Christ, freely offered to us in the gospel.*

Monday: Phil 1:3-6. What is Paul especially thankful for in v 6? What does it mean that God "began a good work in you" (Deut 7:7ff, Rom 8:28-30, 2 Thess 2:13-14)? How do you see this played out in Acts 16:14? How does it comfort you to know that *God* starts this good work in you, it doesn't depend on your initiative, record, feelings? Can anything thwart God's work?

Tuesday: What does Phil 1:6 say God does in addition to beginning this good work? How does all of our incompleteness change our view of fellow sinners? How does it cast us on the grace of God and his faithfulness, even our need for the church? What hope does this verse offer? Consider that God is in the process of completing you, and your fellow saints. How do trials fit into that (e.g. James 2-4)? When will this end (1 Jn 3:2-3)?

Wednesday: Phil 1:6-7. If Paul's certainty about the Philippians is grounded in God's work in v 6, what is it grounded in in v 7? Why does their commitment to him when he was in prison, and when he was defending the gospel demonstrate God's work in them? Look at believers around you—do you see a pattern of godly living (and repenting)? Do you see evidence of God's work in them? What about in you? Give thanks for this!

Thursday: Phil 1:7. How does "you are all partakers of grace" humble the Philippians (Eph 2:10)? What is grace (1 Tim 1:15)? How does this level the playing field when others are more or less gifted? How does the gift of grace remind us of our unity, and of the motivation and strength to serve? Give thanks for God's grace to you and the church.

Friday: Phil 1:8. Consider the glory of "the affection of Christ Jesus." How has Jesus demonstrated that affection (John 15:13)? Do you believe Jesus has affection for you? How is Jesus' love felt by the Philippians through Paul? What are three ways you can/will demonstrate the affection of Christ for your fellow saints?

Saturday: Phil 1:9-11. What does Paul pray for in these verses? Pray the same for yourself and your fellow saints.
